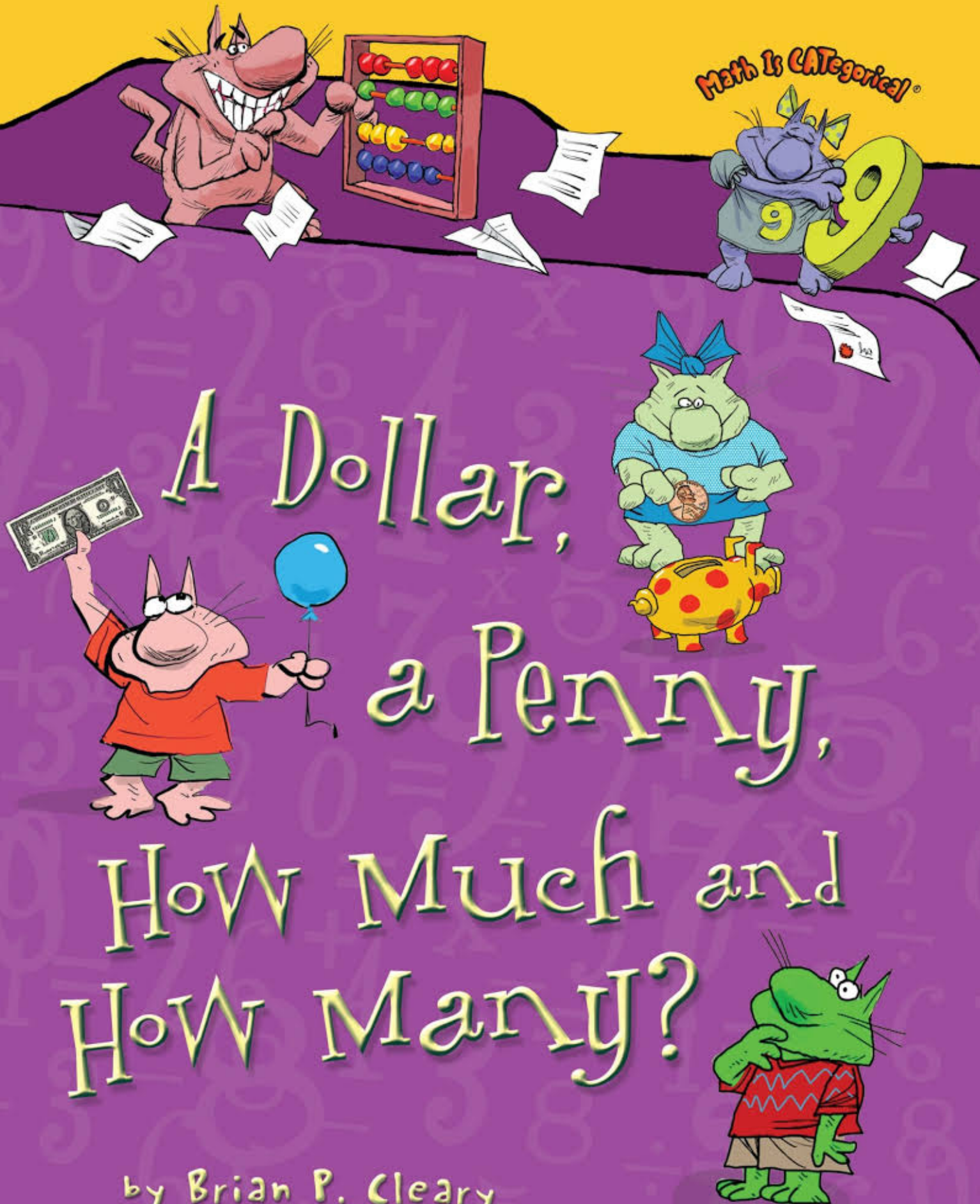

to buy things such as pizzas,



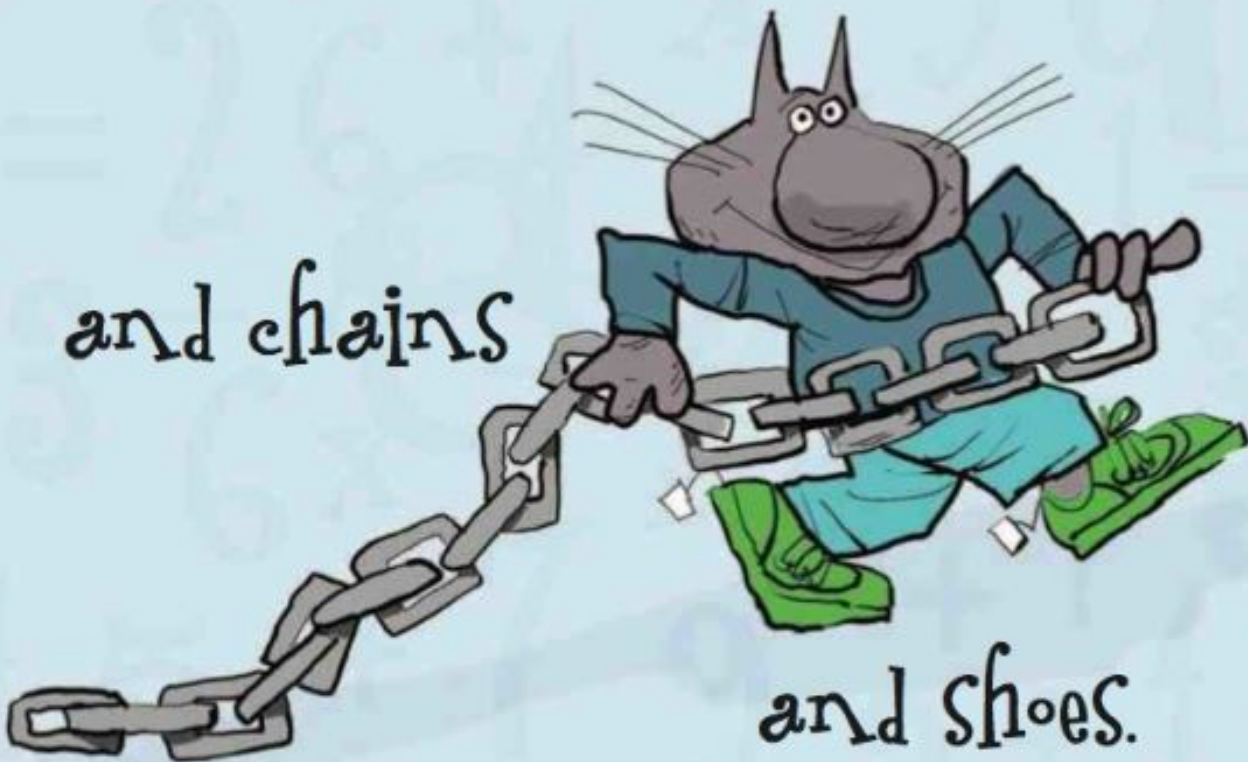
pencils,



planes,



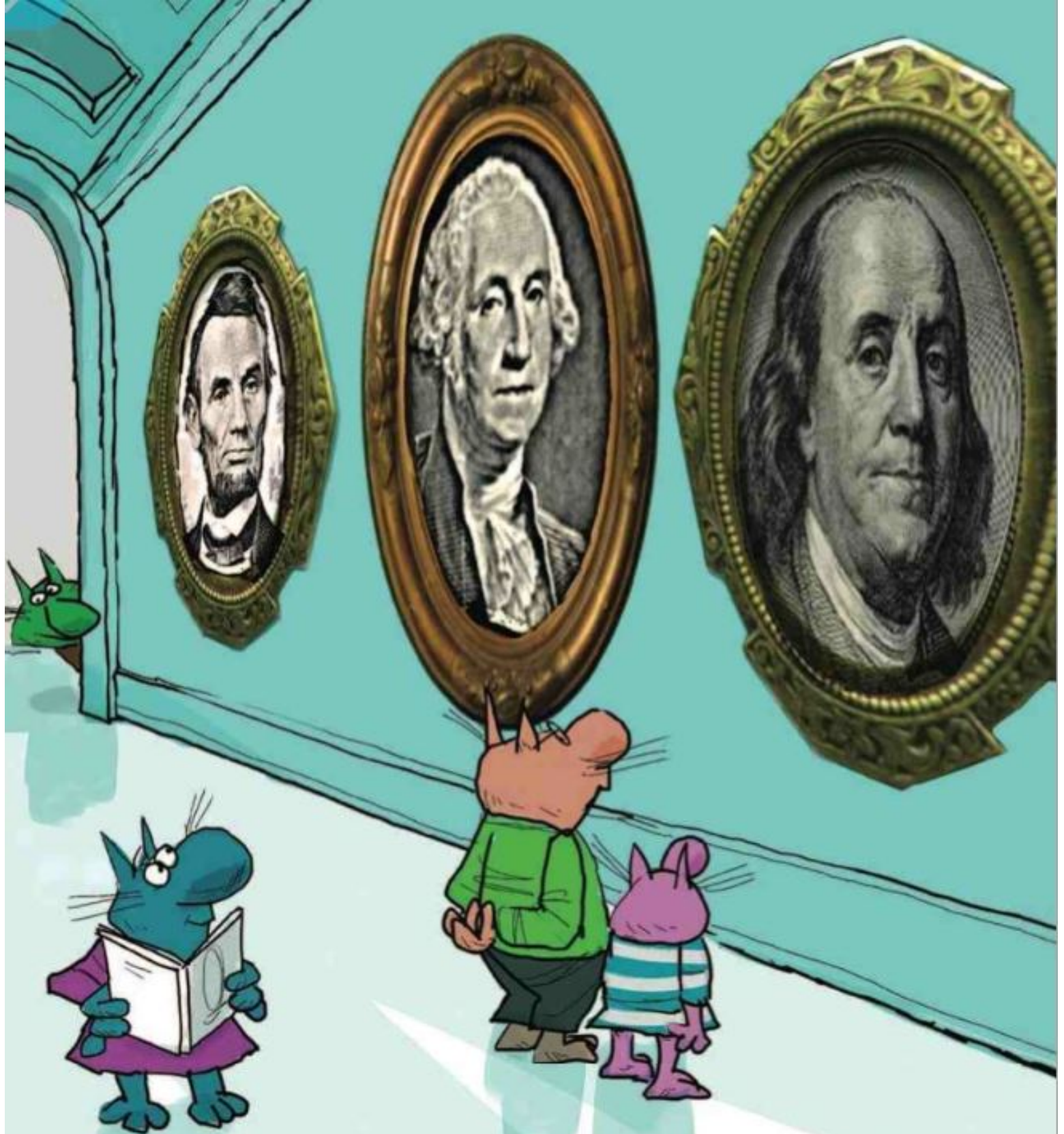
and chains

nickels,

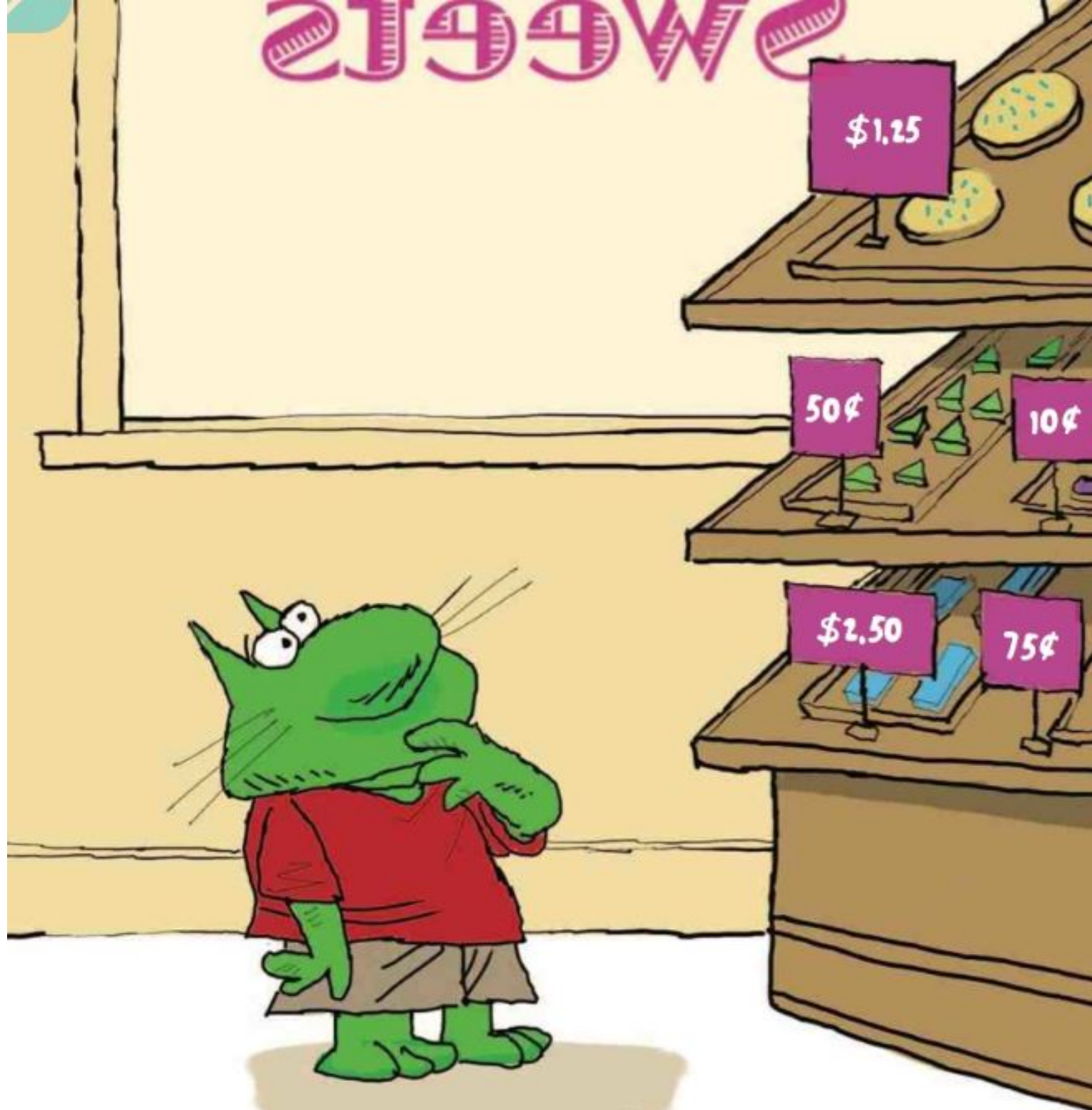


dimes,

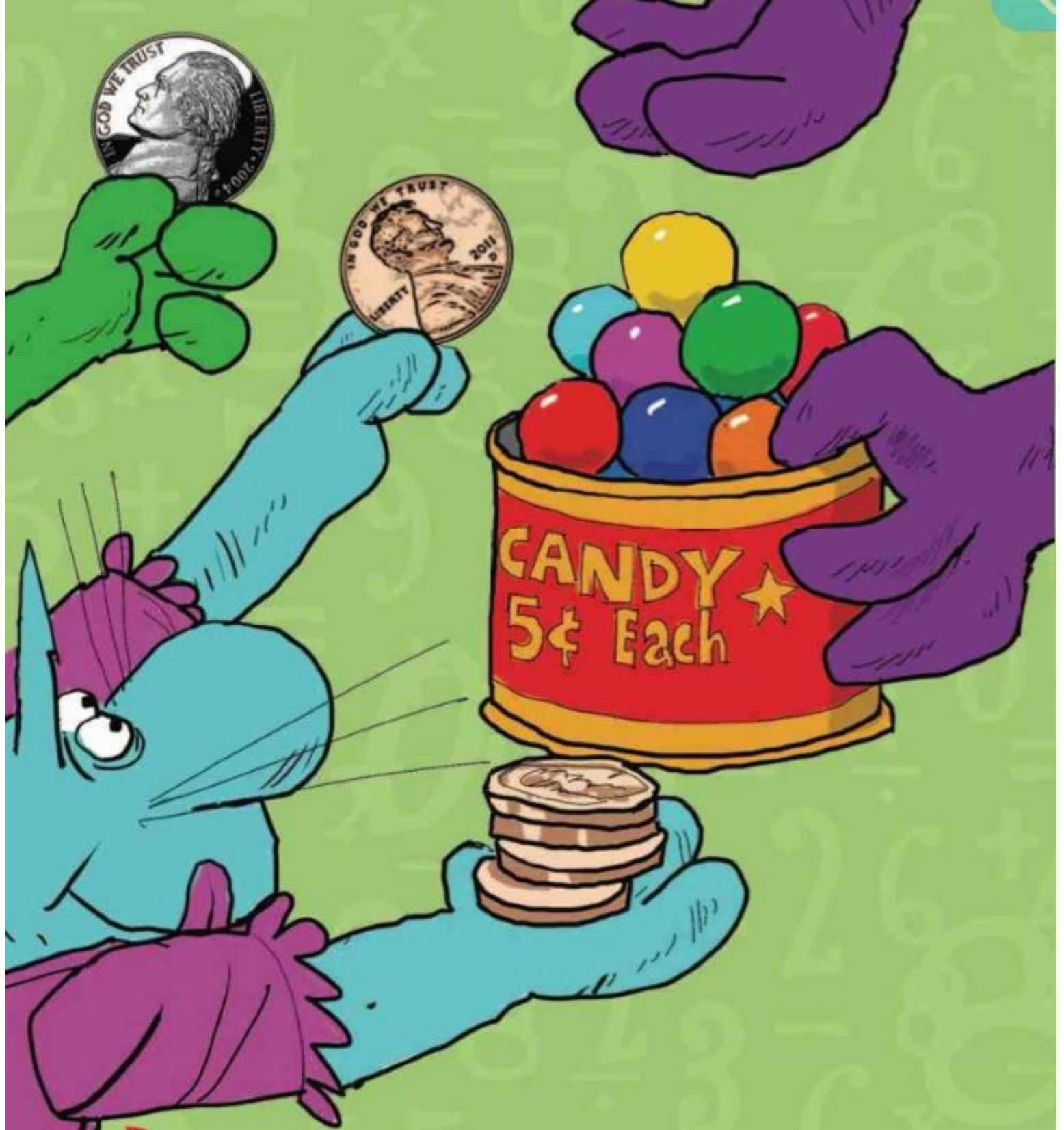


and quarters too,

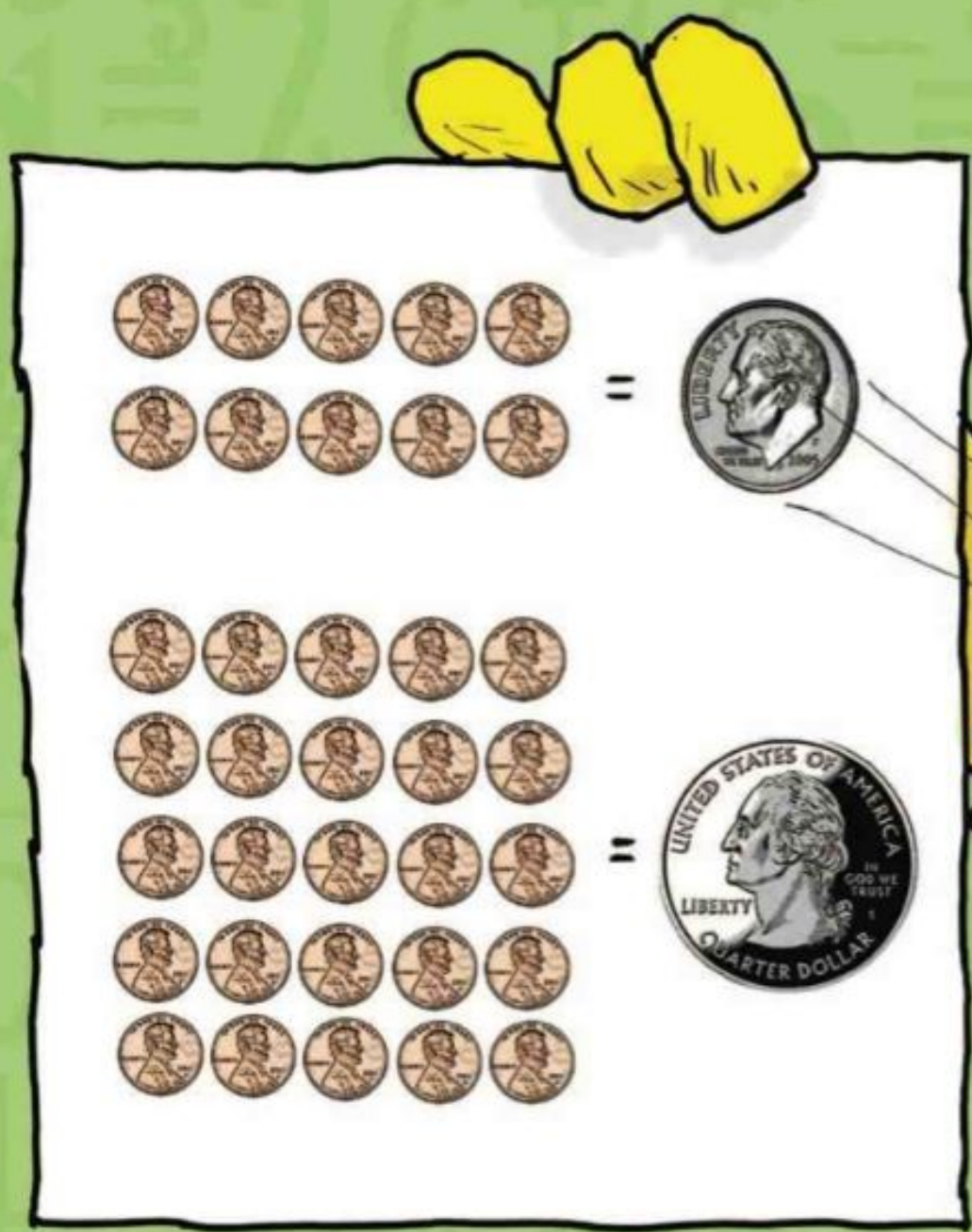
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and you'll know

before this lesson's through.



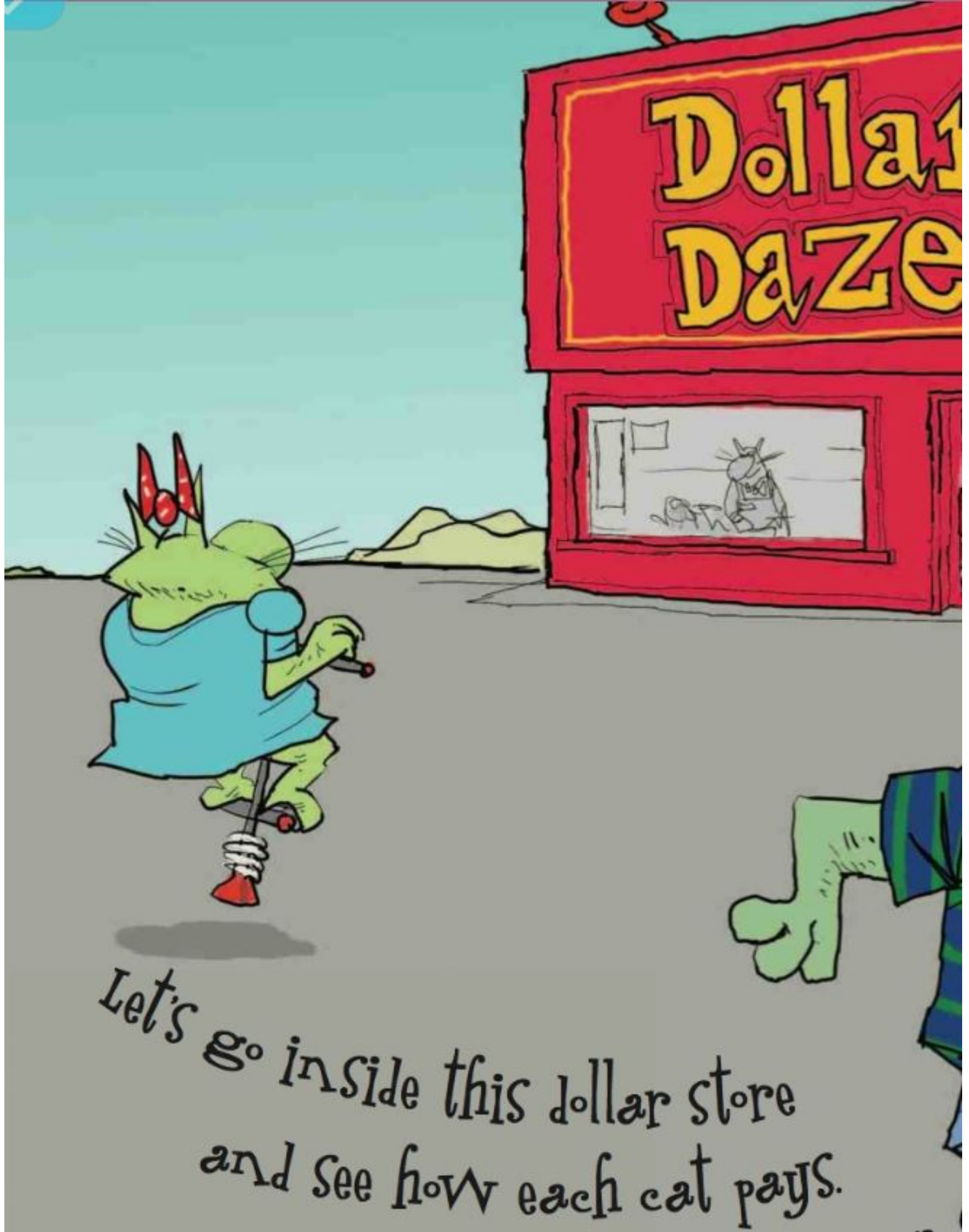
Pennies each are worth 1 cent.
A **nickel** is worth 5.



It takes 10 cents to make a **dime**.
A **quarter's** 25.

1 dollar's worth of coins can look
a lot of different ways.





Let's go inside this dollar store
and see how each cat pays.

Jenny brought 4 quarters, while
10 dimes came with her brother.



Anna paid 100 pennies
(taken from her mother).



Zack hands over 7 dimes,
1 quarter,
plus 5 pennies.





All these combinations prove
to be the same as Jenny's.

Paper money doesn't look or
feel like coins at all.





But it can also pay for things,
however large or small.

10,

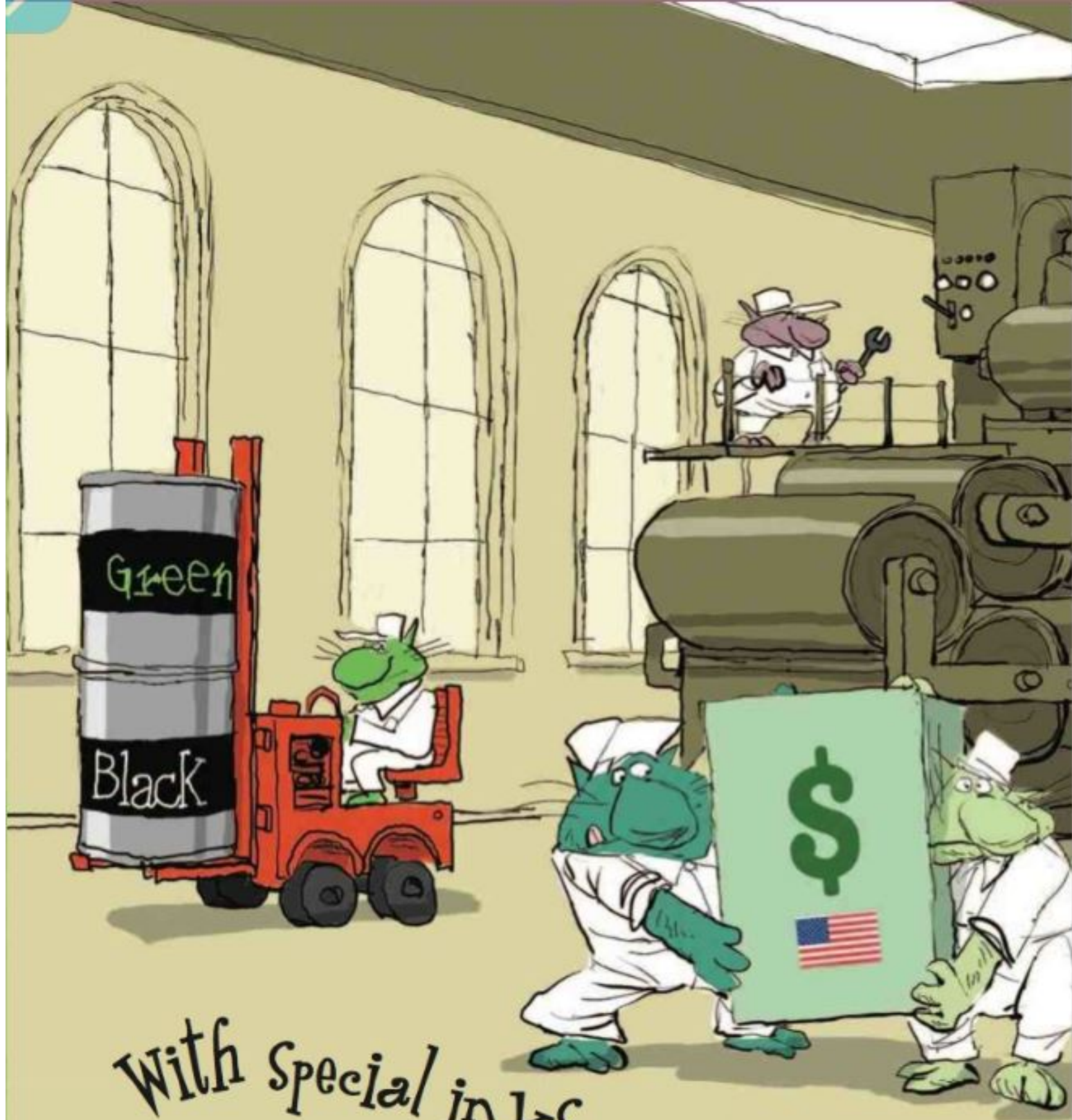


and 5



and 1.

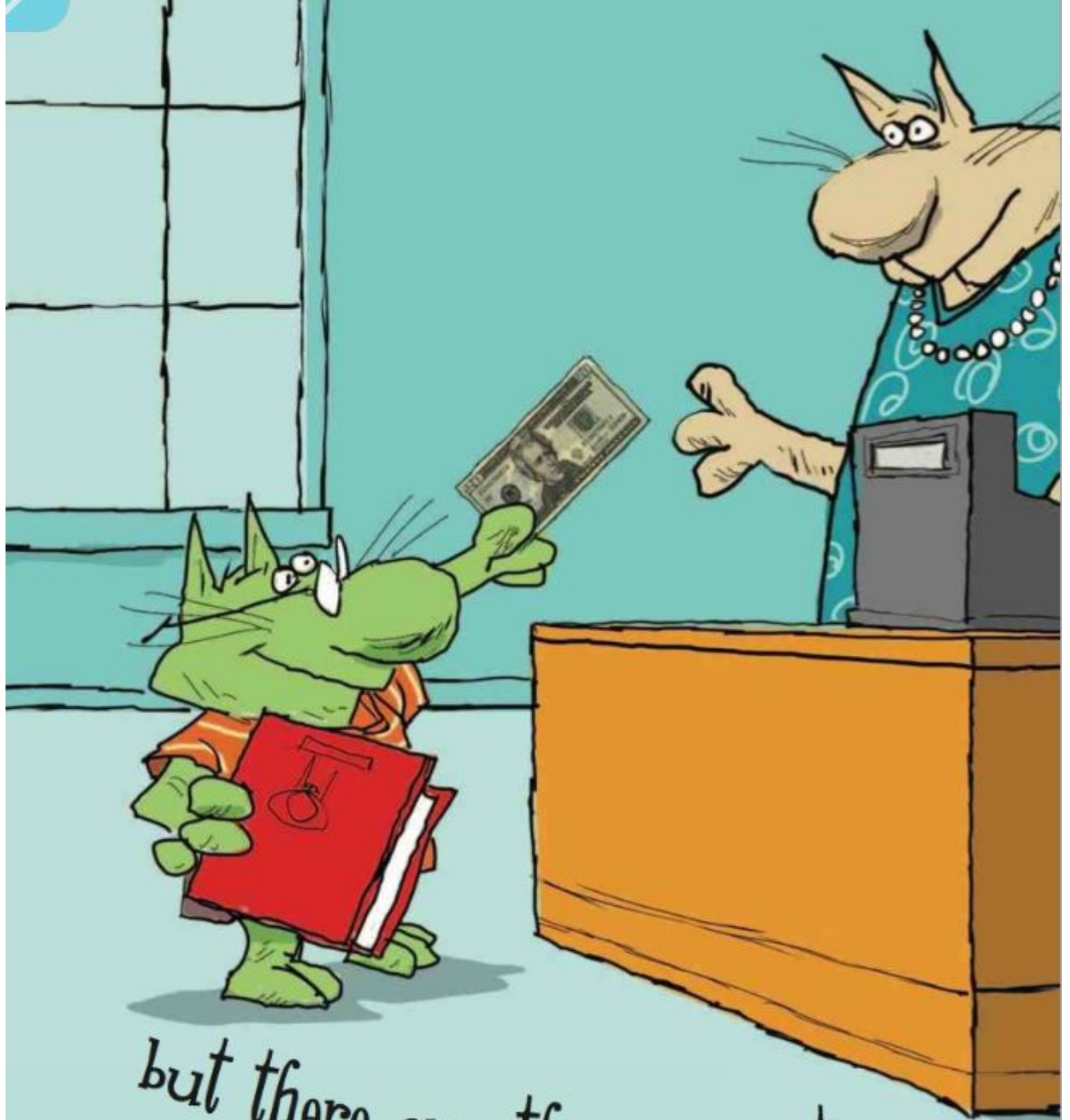




*With special inks,

Two **10s** would do it too,



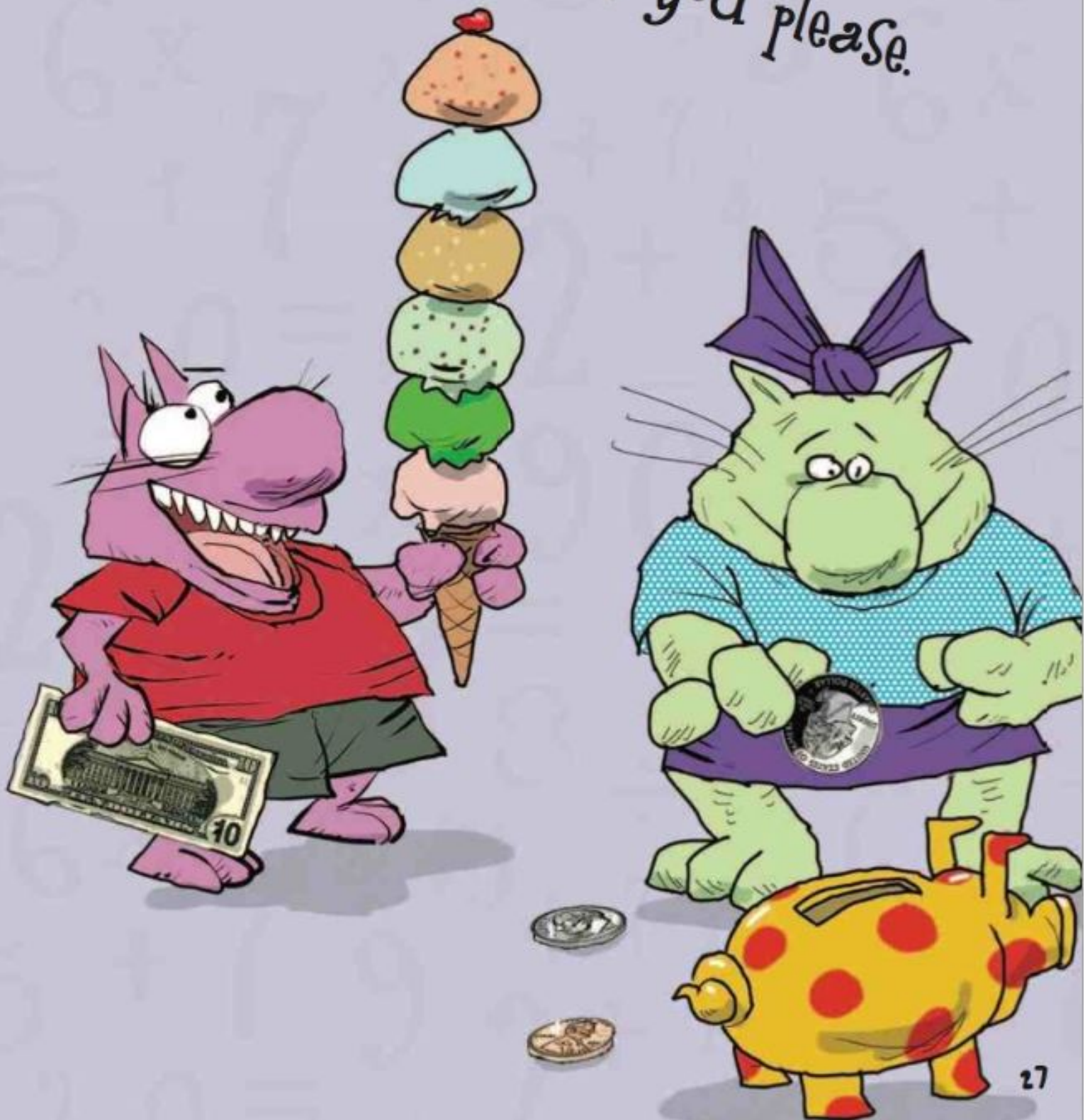


or twenty **1s** would pay the funds.

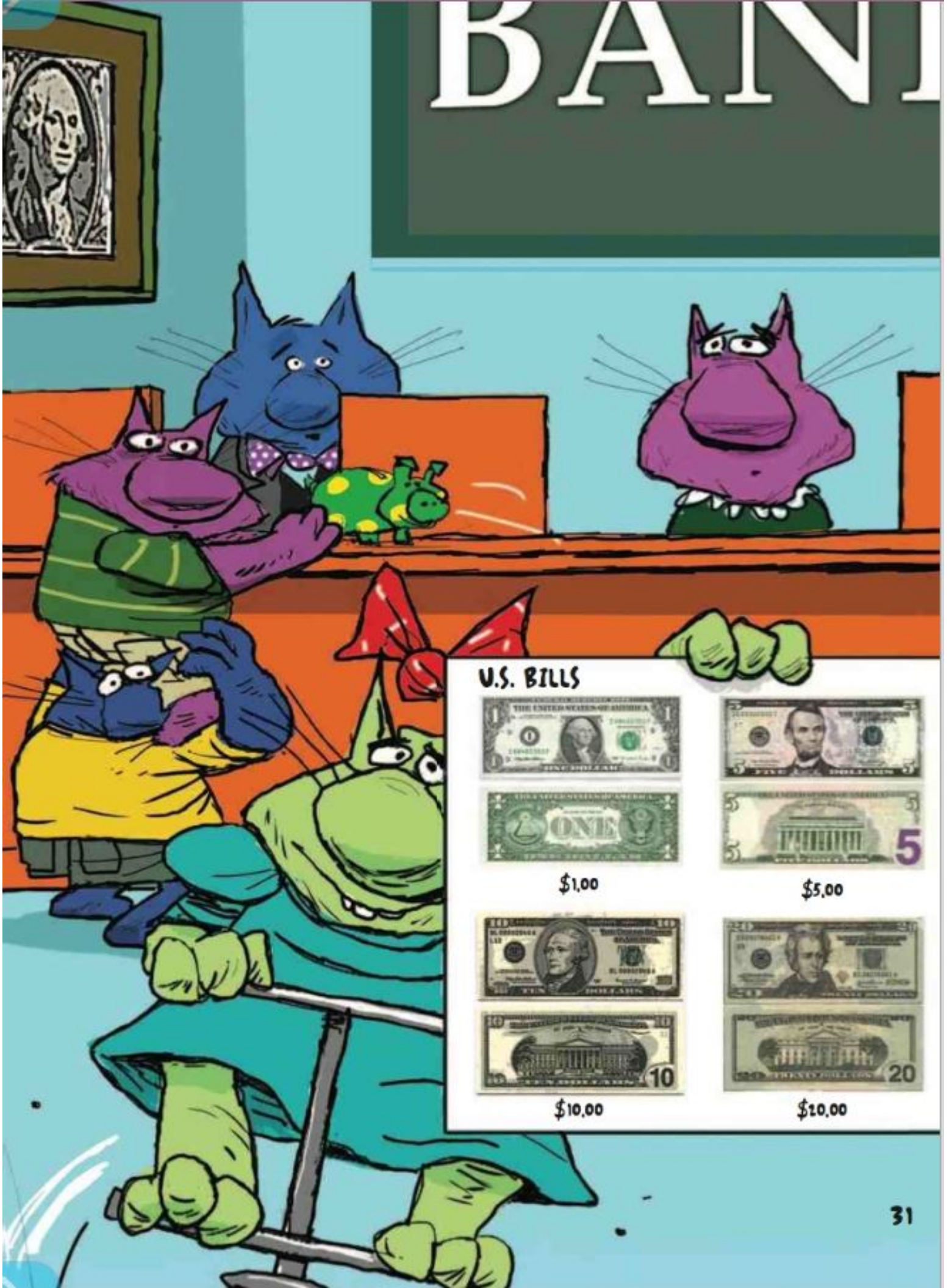
