In the beginning, everywhere was dark and still and empty. But God was there. And he had a plan. "Let's have some light!" he said. And all the lights came on!







"How can I have a baby?" Mary asked. "I don't have a husband."




Shepherds and Angels




The First Christmas

Mary and Joseph loved each other and they got married. One day they had to go on a long trip to Bethlehem.






The Man Who Couldn't Walk

Jesus said God is like the father. He won't ever stop loving us.




God's Wonderful Surprise!
