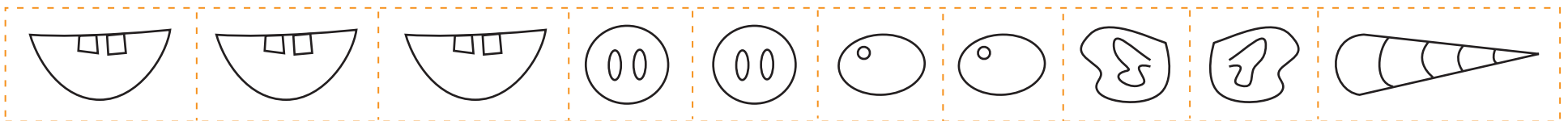
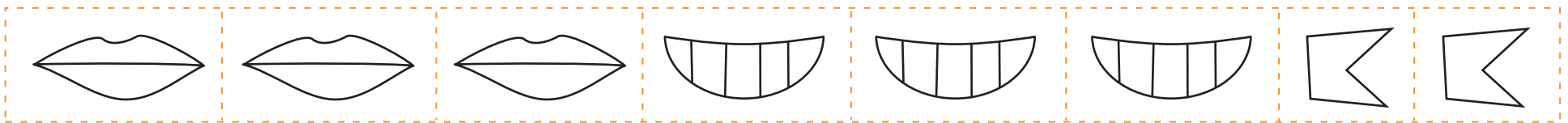
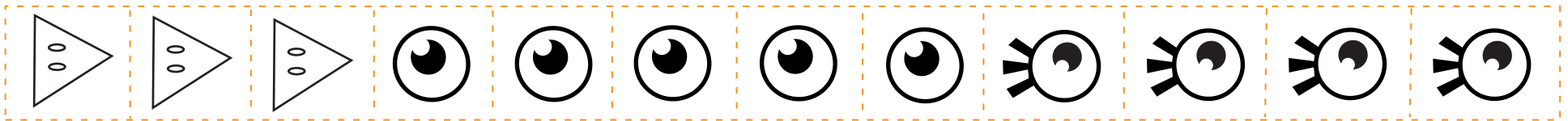
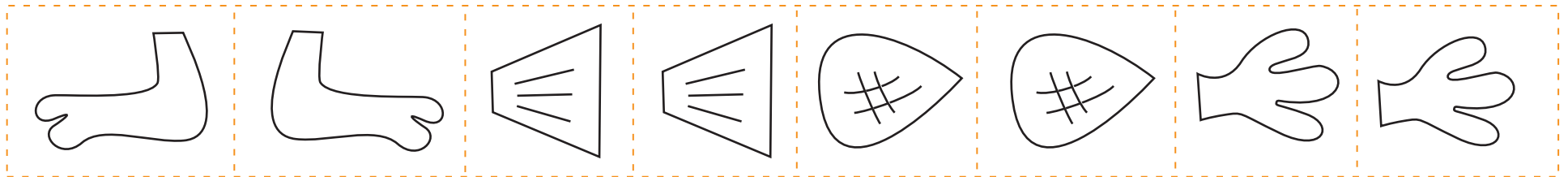
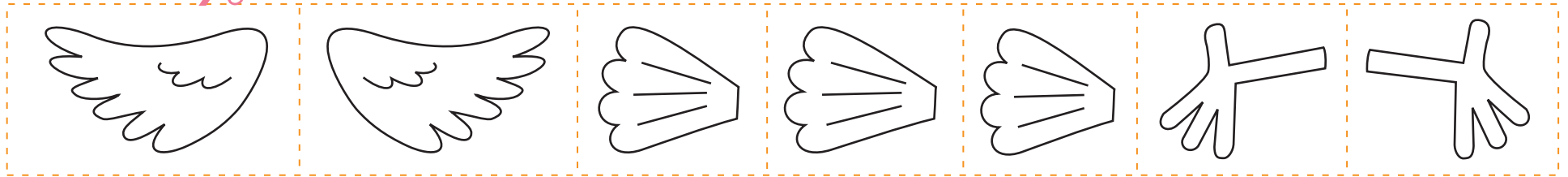


KIDS: Color in the word on this page and art on the next page. Have a grown up help cut out the pieces from the second page. Then paste the pieces onto the word!

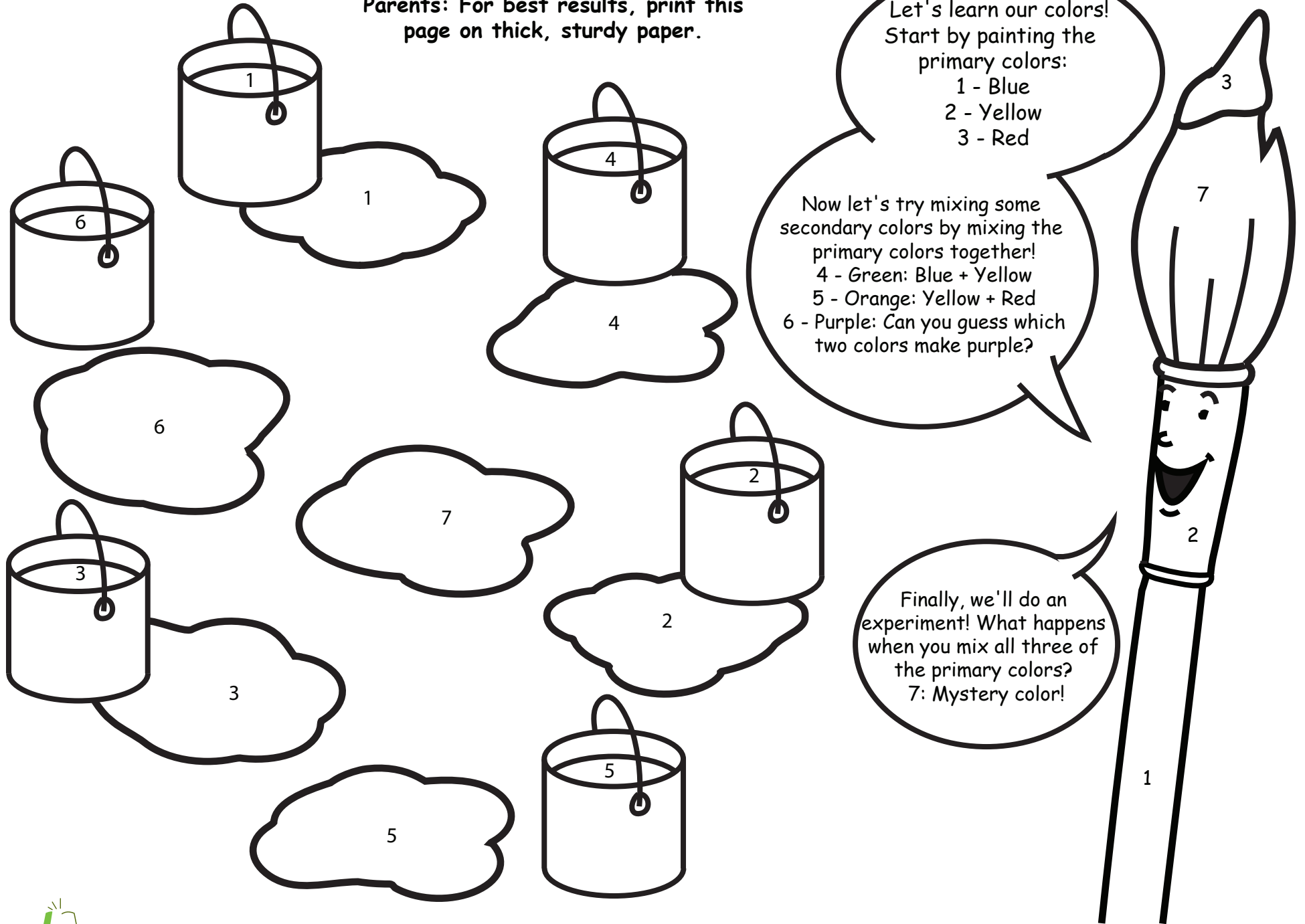
Let's learn our colors!

primary colors:

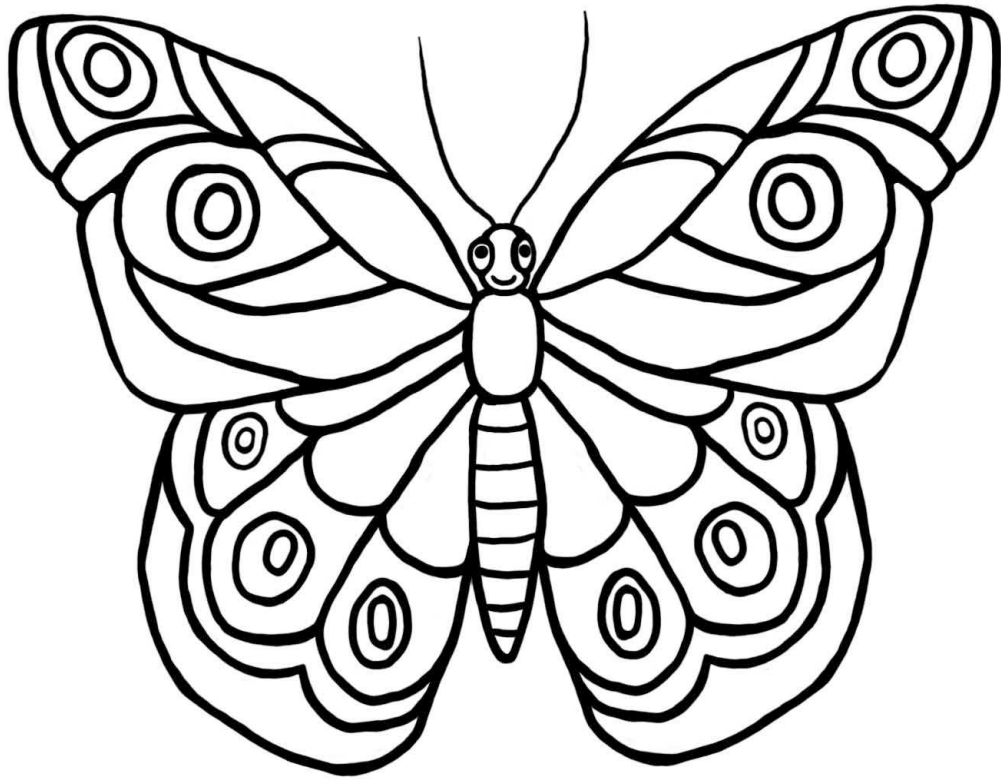
- 1 - Blue
