What Happens Next?


Think about all the different things that Jasmine and Rajah did in the story you just read.



What Animal Am I?

For this activity, you'll need a partner!

Imagine yourself as an animal. Maybe you're a tiger like Rajah, or maybe you're a peacock, or maybe you're some other kind of animal altogether. Once you've chosen your animal, keep it a secret from your partner! They are going to try to guess what kind of animal you are!



Once you've picked your animal, your partner can start asking you questions about yourself, until they can guess what animal you are. But here's the hard part: you can only answer questions with "yes," "no," or "I don't know."

Below are a few examples of questions your partner might ask you!

- Do you have fur?
 - Do you fly?
- Do you have sharp teeth?
 - Do you live on land?
- Do you like to eat fruit?

When your partner has successfully guessed what you are, swap roles! Have your partner imagine they are a type of animal and *you* ask the questions.



Make an Acrostic Poem!
