


'We've got no food, Jack,' says his mother. 'We've got no money. Go and sell the cow!'





So Jack goes up the road. 'Look!' says a strange old man. 'Magic beans! Give me that cow and you can have them!'

'Oh!' says Jack. 'All right!'










'Fee! Fi! Fo! Foy! I can smell a little boy!' says the big giant.

'No, you can't!' says his wife. 'Wash your hands! Your breakfast is ready!'




He eats his breakfast. Then he says, 'Wife! Bring me my gold!'

The giant goes to sleep.


Then Jack comes out quietly. He takes a bag of gold. And quietly he runs away.






Now they live well. But one day there's no more gold.

'Quick! Hide! Get in there!'




'Fee! Fi! Fo! Foy! I can smell a little boy!' says the giant.

Jack hides behind some books.


Soon he hears a noise.


'Fee! Fi! Fo! Foy! I can smell a little boy!' says the giant.


'Can you?' says his wife. 'Is that bad boy here again? Let's look in here. Perhaps he's hiding.'


But they can't find Jack.







