


This is China, in the old days. Every day the sky is blue. Blue, blue, blue.




And every night the sky is black. Black, black, black.





One day a piece of blue falls. It falls out of the sky.


'Look!' says the big girl. 'What is it?' 'It's a piece of the sky!' says the big boy. 'Look! Another one!'

'Here's another!' says the little girl.


'Here's one!' says the big boy.

'How many holes are there?' asks Lownu.



'Don't cry!' says Lownu. 'Give me the pieces of blue. Go and play! I want to think.'




Night comes.

silver apron.




She puts them together.



'Good!' says Lownu. 'Now I have twenty pieces! Twenty pieces to mend the sky.'



'I'm up in the sky!' she says. 'It's time to mend the sky!'






And, 'Flap!' It goes in a hole.

Day comes. The sky is blue again. Blue, blue, blue.




'The sky is blue!' say the children.
