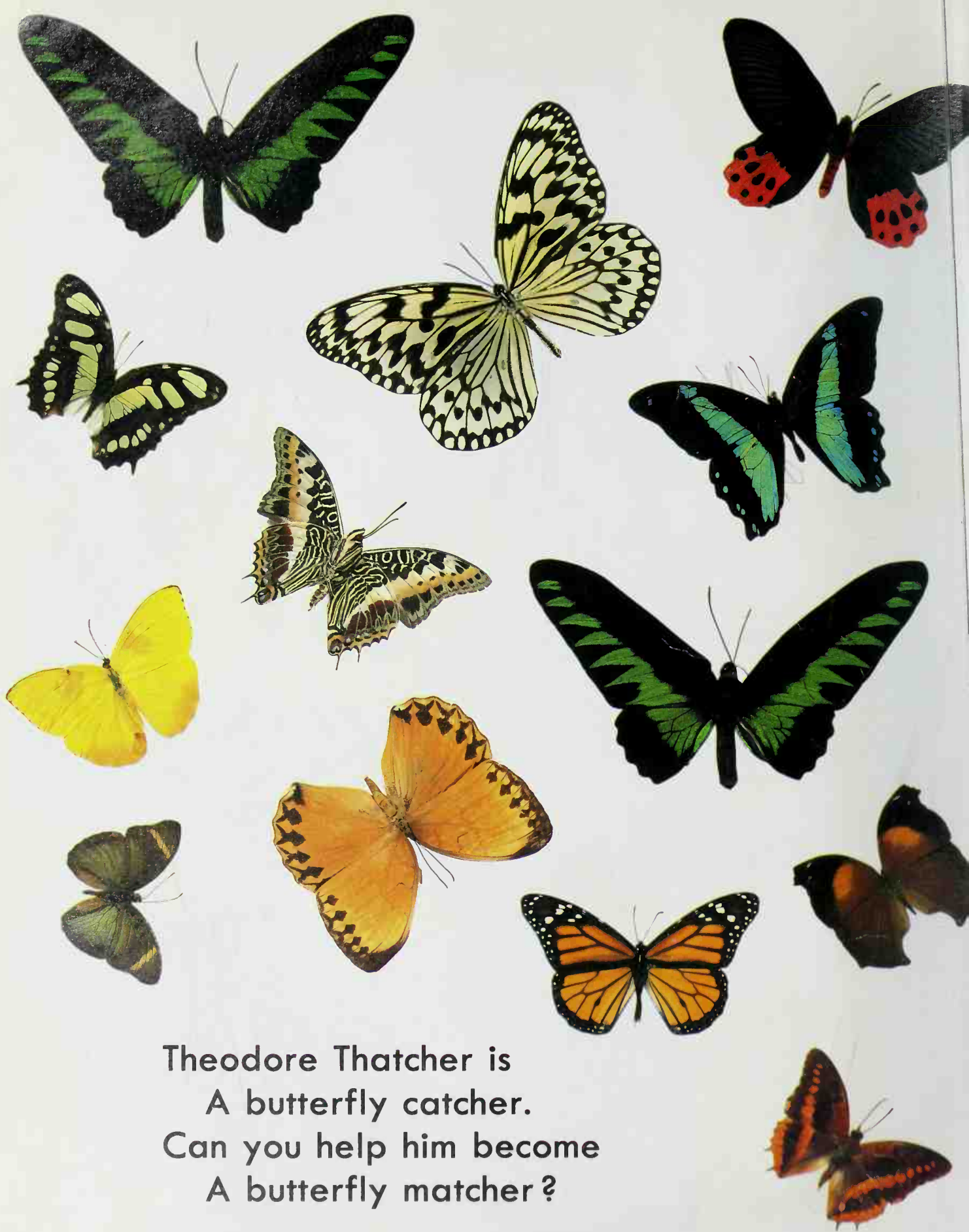

Tell me, what's the catch?



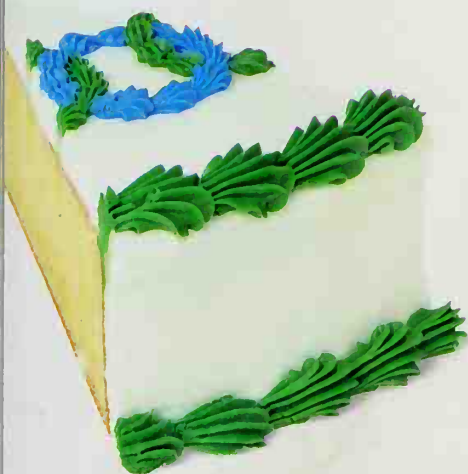

Who wears black? What do you think?

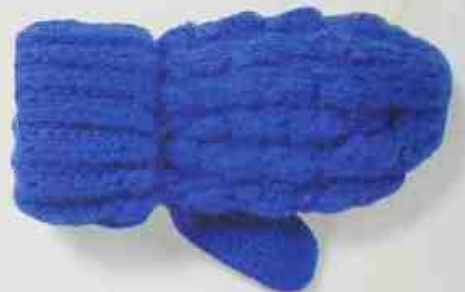




Remember this rule while you play this game:

Each of these rows is a guessing game, too.



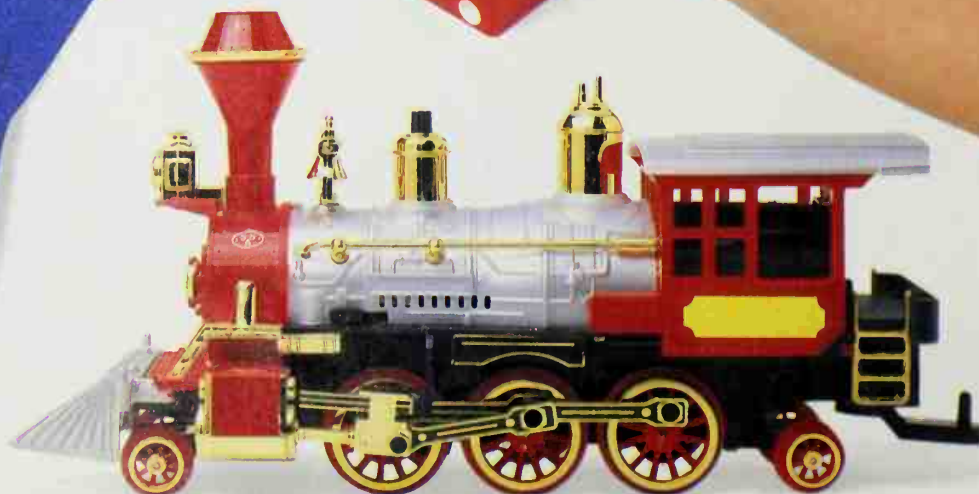
Which things go together? Do you have a clue?

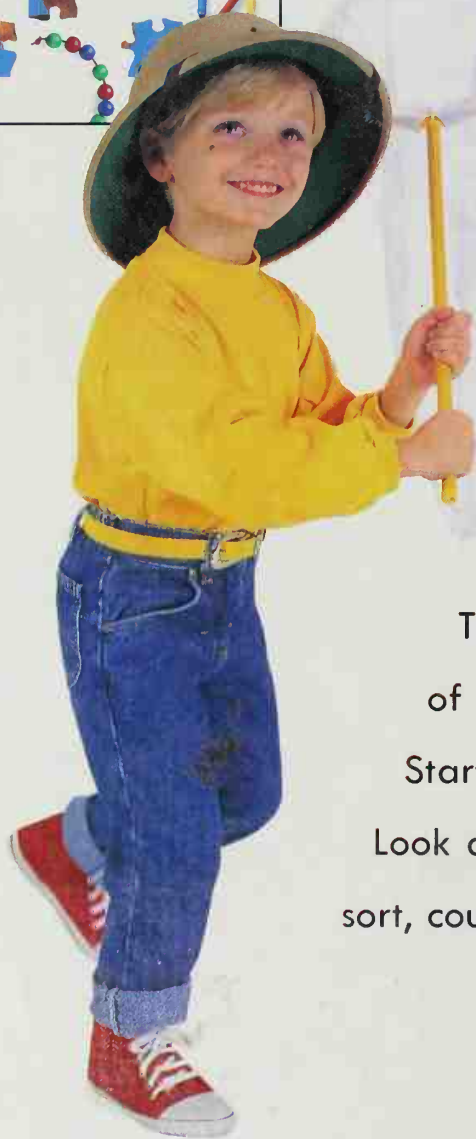
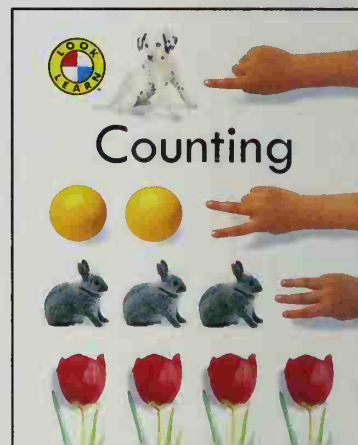
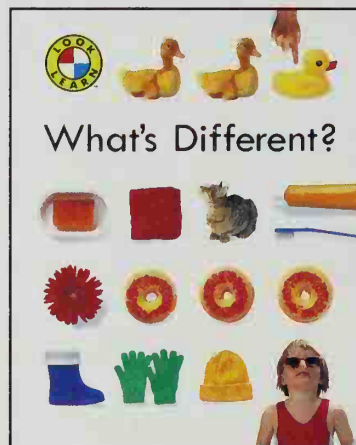
