

# Violinist plays during surgery!

# Mini marsupial lion fossil discovered



Palaeontologists working in Queensland, Australia, have discovered that fossils they were studying belong to a new type of marsupial lion! The domestic cat-sized predator, named Lekaneleo roskellyae, had a pouch to carry its young, and incredibly powerful teeth that were sharp enough to slice through **bone!** Scientists think the fearsome little lion roamed rainforests 20 million years ago, living in trees, hunting snakes, birds and other small animals.

Riversleigh World Heritage Area, where Lekaneleo was uncovered, is the site of many other important finds, including the 2016 discovery of a kitten-sized marsupial lion Microleo attenboroughi – named after Sir David Attenborough. Cool!

# VE DAY 75

8 May marks 75 years since the end of World War Two. Find out more below...

'**VE**' stands for **Victory** in Europe. Six miserable years of war finally came to an end across Europe on **7 May 1945**, although fighting continued in Japan until August.

**Prime Minister Winston Churchill** announced the news at **3pm** on **8 May**, and celebrations erupted around the world. In the **UK**, **music**, dancing and banners filled the streets. Even the Queen (then aged 19) joined in the fun, leaving **Buckingham** Palace to wander unnoticed among the **London** crowds!

This year's early May Bank Holiday is being moved to Friday 8 May to mark the **75th VE Day**. There will be a three-day celebration featuring bagpipers playing at the top of the UK's **four highest** peaks, bell ringing and local **street parties**. Find out more at veday75.org






# Noodle-fingered robot!

A top team of scientists has designed an ultra-soft robot with noodle-like fingers to help them conduct research on jellyfish! The gentle grippers can interact with the slippery organisms without causing any harm.

The marine biologists behind the project want to ensure that future deep sea exploration is as safe and respectful as possible. In the past, specimens have been killed and then brought to the surface in order to study them. But these new soft robots will enable scientists to take **swabs of DNA** from deep-sea organisms in a way that's **stress-free** for the animals. Hooray!



# BunBangFai Rocket Festival

You might want to bring earplugs to this **explosive festival** in **Thailand**'s Yasothon Province, during which teams launch homemade rockets into the sky! The tradition of firing rockets, most of which are **9m long** and packed with **gunpowder**, was originally intended to bring on the **rainy season!** Some special rockets may weigh up to 100kg and fly for over five minutes.



## THE VETERINARIAN

Jan Pol has helped nearly 500,000 animal patients in his 50 years as a vet. Here he recalls two supercute tales - about a pair of injured hounds and a sick kitten...

"Dogs will chase anything that moves – including **porcupines**! One time two **coonhounds** came into the vet clinic with **hundreds** of **porcupine quills** stuck in their muzzles. Ouch! We had to remove the **pointy spines** or they could cause an infection that would make the dogs sick. So we sedated the pups and **plucked** the quills out one by one. They went back to their owner **just fine**, but dogs never learn their lesson – next time they meet a porcupine, I'm sure they'll be back!



PORCUPINE QUILLS

"Another time, a family brought in a stray kitten with a very infected eye. The family didn't want to give up on the kitten, and I didn't either. But I wasn't sure what was wrong until I started the surgery.

"I almost couldn't believe it – a huge insect larva was growing in the kitten's eye! We had to remove the eye, but the kitten was completely fine without it. Even better – the stray kitten found a home with the family who brought it in!"

WANT TO BE A PET TRADE **INVESTIGATOR?** 

Photography and journalism WATCH Blue Planet and *Human Planet* READ Ocean Country by Liz Cunningham

Photojournalist and marine social ecologist Shannon Switzer Swanson investigates how fish go from the coral reef to the pet shop. She hopes that if people know more about the aquarium pet trade they'll make better decisions when looking for a pet fish, helping protect both the fish and the people who catch them. Below she describes a close call while watching a fisherman at work...

"I was in **Indonesia**, **diving** with a man who supports his family by catching fish for the pet trade. I watched him catch a **blue tang** [which only earned him about **80p**] while we breathed through long tubes attached to an air compressor on the **boat** above. After a few minutes in the water, I suddenly

couldn't breathe - the air had stopped flowing through the line! Luckily I'd gone through **scuba training**, so I tried not to panic as I remembered what to do. I had to slowly **exhale** as I came to the surface to avoid getting sick.

"It made me realise that these **fishermen** put their lives at risk **every day** – and they do it because they don't have a better option to earn a living.

I hope people will start being more careful when they purchase an aquarium fish – asking stores **how** the fish was caught. I want them to be willing to pay more for one that was caught sustainably."

#### **ECO-FRIENDLY FISH**

Looking for a new addition to your aquarium? Use these tips to do it sustainably!

- First, ask for fish that were bred in captivity instead of ones that were taken from the wild.
- If the fish you're after can't be raised in captivity, buy from people who know how the fish got from the ocean to the store - for instance, if the pet is 'certified cyanide free' and has not been

## THE WILDLIFE **PROTECTOR**

Conservationist Rosamira **Guillen** works to protect cotton-headed tamarins (also called cotton tops) from habitat destruction and the illegal **pet trade**. These monkeys can only be found in northwestern Colombia, a country in South America, and here Rosamira describes watching them in the wild...

"I was following some **cotton** tops through the forest when I spotted a family of them. The mum and dad were trying to teach a ten-week-old baby how to jump – the parents and siblings were on one branch, and the baby was on another. But the baby didn't want to learn that day – it was crying like a little kid. You could tell it was saying, 'No! Just carry me!'

After **15 minutes** the parents decided they'd had enough, so they scooped him up and moved on.

"We want people to understand that cotton tops aren't pets - they need to be in the wild with their **families**. So my organisation educates people in the local community and asks them to take a pledge not to have a monkey as a pet. Only about 7,000 cotton tops remain in the forest, but I have hope that we can protect these animals and keep them in the wild where they belong!"

Hi Wilbur! Your hero Jack is the youngest member of the Courtney family who you've been writing about for a long time. Can you tell us about that?

The fictional Courtney family appeared in my first novel, When the Lion Feeds, first published in **1964**. Since then the Courtneys have become the **longest**running family saga in publishing history, spanning over **20 books** and more than **50 years**.

Wow! You're best known as an author of adult books and have sold 130 million copies

worldwide. Why did you decide to write for children?

I was inspired by what young people are doing to question what is happening with the environment. It felt like a good idea to try to speak directly to them through my characters and my writing.

Why do you think adventures are important?

Having an **adventure** is the only way you are certain to learn something about yourself and your world at the same time. If that is not available to you, then reading adventure stories may broaden your horizons in unexpected ways!

What are you hoping that readers will take away from reading the book?

I hope they will learn something about Africa, about the cruelty and kindness of mankind, the beauty of nature and wildlife, and discover something about **themselves** in the process.

Hi Chris! What was it like writing a book with the famous Wilbur Smith?! I've only ever written books on my own before - it's a **lonely** process. So working with Wilbur is great, collaborative fun. We

brainstorm ideas and bat drafts back and forth. Wilbur is the master at ratcheting up tension. He sharpens the story and I make it sing! What kind of research did you do?

Lots! I read up on 'resource wars' in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (where the book is set), and learned how tantalum - the stuff used to make our mobile phones - is dug by hand from African mines. I also interviewed a BBC expert on mountain gorillas, and watched some amazing wildlife films (a tough job but somebody's got to do it!).

You also work as a travel writer. Have you been on any real-life adventures?

I've dived with sharks in Australia, narrowly avoided being kidnapped in Kashmir [a region divided between three countries – India, Pakistan and China] and slept in a tent surrounded by lions in Kenya, Africa. I've also eaten fire-ants in Puerto Rico [an island in the Caribbean.] They taste peppery and you have to chew them quickly.

Yikes! What are you hoping that readers will take away from reading the book?

A sense of excitement, affection for Jack and his friends, and a burning desire to read their next adventure, which, spoiler alert, is called THUNDERBOLT.

#### YOU CAN HELP

About one million species of plants and animals are in danger of becoming extinct in the next few decades, according to a report from the United Nations. But we still have time to help. By working together, scientists, politicians and kids like you can make positive changes.

Have a favourite animal you want to protect? Here's how you can help save them!





#### BUTTERFLIES

It's thought three-quarters of **British butterflies** are now in decline, with four species going extinct in the last century.

#### HOW YOU CAN HELP


Plant **buddleia** for butterflies, and let stinging nettles grow for caterpillars to eat. **Avoid pesticides**!

#### **ELEPHANTS**

The world's largest land mammals are still poached for their ivory despite a ban on the trade.

#### HOW YOU CAN HELP

Adopt an elephant at wwf.org.uk and never ever buy trinkets made from ivory.



#### **RED PANDAS**

Crazy-cute animals like red
pandas, slow lorises and
Asian small-clawed otters
are being captured from the
wild and sold illegally as pets
– even though these animals
suffer when they live
in people's homes.

#### HOW YOU CAN HELP

Never purchase an animal that should be living in the wild and ask your parents not to 'like' photos and videos of these animals as pets on social media.

#### LIONS

The African lion population has decreased by half in the past 25 years because of things like habitat loss and poaching.

#### HOW YOU CAN HELP

Instead of a birthday gift, ask your friends and family to donate to an organisation that protects your favourite animal. Lions certainly need help, but you can pick whatever animal you want!





#### **GORILLAS**

Most mobile phones and computers contain a mineral called coltan, which is mined in gorilla and chimpanzee habitats in Africa.

HOW YOU CAN HELP Coltan can be reused, so always recycle your tech to prevent the need for more mining.

#### **PANGOLINS**

These mammals are poached for their **scales**, which some people think can be used as **medicine**. But just like **rhino horns**, pangolin scales are made of **keratin** – they **don't** have any **medicinal value**.

#### HOW YOU CAN HELP

Many people don't even realise that pangolins exist. So write a report, make a poster or send a letter to your local newspaper to let people know that they need help.

#### **SEA TURTLES**

Floating in the water, plastic shopping bags look just like a leatherback sea turtle's favourite snack – jellyfish.

#### HOW YOU CAN HELP

Say **no** to plastic carrier bags and instead carry a **reusable tote or rucksack**. Have a look at **kidsagainstplastic.co.uk** for more tips on how to reduce your plastic use.







#### **SHARKS**

An estimated **three million sharks** are **killed** each year to harvest their **liver**, which is put into products like **sunscreen**. Others are **unintentionally caught** through **commercial fishing**.

#### HOW YOU CAN HELP



Choose products marked 'cruelty free' and look for sustainably sourced seafood (meaning your meal was caught in an eco-friendly way).

# Common frog

#### **FROGS**

According to a recent survey by the **RSPB**, **frog** numbers are **decreasing** in the UK.

#### HOW YOU CAN HELP

If you've got a garden, think about creating a **simple pond** from an old **washing-up bowl** placed in a **hole** dug in the ground. Fill it with **rainwater** and add stones or bits of wood for access. Buy **pond plants**, too.

#### SEAHORSES

Chemicals in some sunscreens can kill coral, the tiny animals that create reefs. These coral reef ecosystems support thousands of species, including seahorses, blue tang and whale sharks.

#### HOW YOU CAN HELP

Simply slather on sunscreen that's labelled 'reef safe' next time you hit the beach.



#### **VULTURES**

Many of these magnificent scavengers are on the edge of extinction. They're often poisoned by poachers to stop them drawing attention to illegal kills.

#### HOW YOU CAN HELP

Spread the word that vultures are awesome!
Nature's 'clean-up crews', these incredible birds prevent the spread of disease.





#### **SLOTHS**

Parts of the Amazon rainforest are being burned to clear land for cattle. This destroys the homes of animals like sloths, anteaters and toucans. The beef is shipped to burger-hungry countries worldwide.

#### HOW YOU CAN HELP

Eating meatless meals even once a week could help protect the rainforest and the animals that live there.



#### SAVE OUR SEALIFE!

Carry a reusable bottle filled with water from home instead of buying single-use plastic water bottles.
Nearly one million plastic bottles are sold every minute.



Pack your lunch or snacks in reusable containers made of silicone, glass or metal instead of single-use plastic bags.
Then carry them all in a reusable lunch bag.



#### **ORANGUTANS**

Some rainforests where orangutans live are being destroyed to grow palm oil trees. The oil is sometimes used in products such as peanut butter, chocolate, ice cream and soap.

#### HOW YOU CAN HELP

Try to **avoid** items that contain palm oil, or look for a label that confirms it was grown in a way that's **rainforest-friendly**.



#### **TIGERS**

Snapping pics with a captive tiger or riding an elephant might seem harmless but these animals often suffer behind the scenes – and they should be living in the wild.

#### HOW YOU CAN HELP

Don't visit facilities where animals are chained, performing for entertainment, or interacting with people who aren't keepers. Instead, watch wild animals behaving naturally from afar.



Plastic straws and stirrers will be banned this April (hooray!) but plastic cutlery is still allowed (so far). So carry reusable cutlery for picnics and takeaways!


### LEARN ABOUT CITES

The Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES) is an agreement between the governments of 183 countries to make sure that the trade of wild animals and plants doesn't threaten their survival.

Depending on the protection needed, this could mean that trade is banned almost completely – for example ivory from elephant tusks – or there could be tight controls surrounding it.

CITES came in to force in 1975 with the UK signing up in 1976. Currently 35,000 species are listed. Without it, it's likely many more animals would have gone extinct.

Keep learning about CITES, researching how it has helped your favourite animals. Then tell your friends and family what you've discovered. By spreading the word about animals, you're helping to save them!



# THE D

**National Geographic Explorer Amy Dickman** tells us about working with warriors and 'magic' dogs to save lions!



#### Hi Amy! When did you first become interested in big cats?

I've been hypnotised by them for as long as I can remember! As a small child I would stare at big cats at the local zoo. There's something beguiling about these beautiful animals that are so **powerful** they can **kill you!** Why are lions important to the world? From the dawn of human existence they've captured our imagination – there are **cave** paintings of lions from over 30,000 years ago! Lions symbolise bravery, wildness, strength and courage, and they're the most common national animal in the world. You see them on **flags**, **sports teams** – everywhere! They're iconic. You set up the Ruaha Carnivore Project in Tanzania, Africa, to reduce conflict between lions and humans. What's the main cause of this conflict?

For many people in Tanzania, especially those living close to National Parks, their cattle are at risk from lion attacks. And their cattle aren't just worth money, they're also really **significant** to people's social status -A massive male

so protecting livestock from lions is **really important**. Lion killing is a cultural tradition in some tribes, for example the Barabaig

tribe in southern Tanzania. Why is that? In areas where lions are a major threat to livestock and people, young men warriors – are rewarded by the community if they kill lions. So we talked with them about ways they could still be warriors (protecting their community, being **strong** and **brave**) but through **conservation** rather than lion killing. Did it take time for them to trust you? A long time! We spent two years out in the bush trying to engage with the **Barabaig**, because we knew there was lots of lion killing, but they wouldn't talk to us. That changed one day when we put up solar panels and they arrived to charge their phones. Technology brought us together! We explained we weren't trying



to get them in trouble, we just wanted to understand why they were killing lions. And did the Barabaig decide to work with you after that?

Yes – but then within a week they'd killed seven more lions! We were really upset about it, but realised it was a **test** – they wanted to see if we valued the lions more than the **relationship** with the **community**. So we **didn't react**. Sure enough, a week

> later they said, "Now we want to work with you." Since then we've joined together with them to prevent over **120 local** lion hunts.

on me!

threats to lions is conflict with Every day, they go out and humans. **track lions**, and if the lions come too close to cattle or people, they'll **chase them** off. They're the guardians of the community. The whole village also look after and monitor the camera traps and there's a reward **programme** for animals they see. How else have you helped protect cattle? We reinforce livestock enclosures with wire, which reduces attacks by over 95%! We also use specialised livestock guarding dogs from Europe – called **Anatolian shepherd dogs** (see pic, above).



Was working with dogs new for them? The Barabaig had local village dogs but nobody knew you could train them. When we suggested it, people thought we were crazy! Then one day, we were at a village meeting and two of our dogs came by. They were getting in the way so I told them to 'sit' in Swahili, and they did. The meeting ground to a halt. "Where did you get those magic dogs?!"

they said. "How can they speak **Swahili**?!" The villagers were **amazed** that dogs could **follow people's commands**. And that opened the door to us bringing in guarding dogs. Now the community love

them. If the dogs sense a predator they bark to alert a herder, who can **chase the lion away**. the main

Have YOU ever felt scared of lions?


On my very **first night** working in the bush in the **Ruaha landscape**, Tanzania, I was staying in this tiny

tent on the floor. I heard a lion's roar that **sounded really close**, but I reminded myself that **roars** can **travel for 8km**, so it was probably not that near. But then it roared again, much **louder**. I thought, "I'm getting out of here!" Except then I remembered that if lions can't get into a cattle enclosure, what they do is go around and around it to scare the cattle into **breaking out** – and *then* they **attack** them. And I thought, "Be more intelligent than a cow, Amy! Don't get out!" So you stayed in the tent?! I forced myself to! The next thing I

knew I could see this huge male lion silhouetted against the tent in the light of the full moon! He walked around the tent, sniffing. Deeply terrified, I searched my bag and found a tiny knife and a deodorant spray to try to defend myself with. But then he suddenly slumped right down on the tent, laid across me and just went to **sleep!** And eventually *I* went to sleep, too, from the sheer **exhaustion** and **adrenaline**!

Wow, what a story! Thanks, Amy!
