





It is summer in a village in Japan. An old man and woman eat dumplings.

'Stop!' says the baby. 'Don't cut me!' There's a baby in the peach! A baby boy – a peach boy!




He is a wonderful baby, and he is happy. The old man and woman call him Momotaro – Peach Boy.

The old man and woman are good to Momotaro. So Momotaro is good too.




Then one day ogres come. Ogres come to the village.

Momotaro walks along. Then he sees a big dog.




'Hi, dog!' says Momotaro. 'I want to fight the ogres. Have a dumpling and come with me!'

So the pheasant eats the dumpling. Then it goes with them.




'My friends,' says Momotaro, the Peach Boy. 'Let's go to Ogre Island.
