

Materials: Do-A-Dot paints, stamps, or stickers.


Directions: Using your chosen material, make a trail from the start to finish following the crowns with stars. Remember to ignore the crowns with other shapes on them.
















Castle Lacing Card





Decorate the Princess's Dress One-to-One Correspondence Activity


Materials needed: Small stickers (or any another small object to use as place markers)

Directions: Have your child place one sticker on each polka dot to decorate the princess's dress.




Race to the Frog Prince


Castle Grid Game v.1





Perfume Clip Cards

Alternatively, if you laminate them your child can use a dry erase marker to circle the correct number.






1-20 Number Trail

Have your child connect the dots from 1 to 49 in order to make a picture.




Princess Graphing





Princess Addition Game

Directions: Print the addend and sum number cards on the next pages and cut them out. Print the Princess addition board. You may wish to laminate both the number cards and the Princess addition board for greater durability.

Have your child select an addend number card and place it in the left addend box on the board. Have your child count out that number of objects and place them on the board.

Have your child select a second addend number card and place it in the right addend box on the board. Have your child count out that number of objects and place them on the board.



Princess Subtraction Game

Materials: White minuend and subtrahend cards, yellow difference cards, and 20 small objects for counting (e.g., glass gems, coins, mini erasers).

Directions: Print and cut the white and yellow number cards on the next pages. Print the Princess Subtraction Game playing board. You may wish to laminate both the number cards and the Princess Subtraction Game playing board for greater durability.

To play, have your child select two of the white number cards. Your child should put the greater number in the left minuend box and the lesser number in the middle subtrahend box.

Then, have your child count out objects equal to the number in the left minuend box and place them on the game board.

Next, have your child take away objects equal to the number in the right subtrahend box.

Finally, have your child find the yellow difference card that represents the number of objects remaining. Your child should place the yellow difference card in the difference box to the right of the equals sign.


Note: Depending on your child's skill level, you may want to start with just white numbers 1 to 5 or 1 to 10 rather than numbers up to 20.
