'Curupira!' they say. 'Curupira!'




Curupira has red hair and strange feet. His feet are backwards! He is strong and very fast, and he can whistle very loud.

The rainforest is very big. But the children are safe with Curupira. The animals and trees are safe too. Curupira is their friend.








'Please help them, Curupira,' says a little girl.




















It is evening now, and they want to go home.




