

PUFFY FELT DECORATIONS CRAFT FOR THE HOLIDAYS

Put Your Game Face On And Make These Playful Felt Decorations!

What you will need:

- Regular printer paper
- Freezer paper
- Marker
- Embroidery needle
- Multi-colored embroidery thread
- Cotton filler

- Stick or pencil
- Colored beads
- Tacky glue •
- Gold stretch cord •
- Sharp scissors •
- Electric iron •

Kids, have a grown-up help you with the iron, scissors and needle.





Ralph Decoration

To begin, print out the templates onto regular paper. Overlay the freezer paper and trace the shapes onto the matte side of the freezer paper. **TIP:** If more than one shape is the same colored felt, gang those together as you trace the shapes.

Lay the freezer paper, shiny side down onto the felt. Use a warm iron to temporarily adhere the freezer paper onto the felt. Press down for about 6 seconds or until the paper adheres to the felt. Trim out the shapes with a sharp scissor. Peel away the freezer paper from the felt. Don't forget the gold cord loop for the hanger while stitching!

Start the blanket stitch here for a puffy deco-ration.

beige (outline)

Pause the stitching here to leave a hole to insert filler.


Flat Instructions:

- 1. Cut out the outline.
- 2. Glue on the shirt and pants first, and then layer on the other shapes to make the decoration.
- 3. Use embroidery thread to stitch in the eyes and mouth.
- 4. Make a loop from the cord and tie a knot. Glue the cord to the top of the decoration to hang.

TIP: Cut a second outline of Ralph and glue to the back for a more sturdy decoration.

- 1. Follow the flat directions.
- 2. Cut a second beige outline of Ralph.
- 3. Make a loop from the cord and tie a knot. Set aside and remember to insert it at the top of the decoration just before stitching that area closed.
- 4. Begin to blanket stitch the front and back pieces together, leaving an opening as shown on the template. This opening will be used to fill the decoration. Use a stick or pencil to push the filler into the decoration. When filled, finish stitching to complete the decoration!








Vanellope Decoration

To begin, print out the templates onto regular paper. Overlay the freezer paper and trace the shapes onto the matte side of the freezer paper. **TIP:** If more than one shape is the same colored felt, gang those together as you trace the shapes.

Lay the freezer paper, shiny side down onto the felt. Use a warm iron to temporarily adhere the freezer paper onto the felt. Press down for about 6 seconds or until the paper adheres to the felt. Trim out the shapes with a sharp scissor. Peel away the freezer paper from the felt.




Flat Instructions:

- 1. Cut out the outline.
- 2. Glue on her outfit and use embroidery thread to stitch in the white stripes on her tights, and then layer on the other shapes to make the decoration.
- 3. Use embroidery thread to stitch in the eyes and eyebrows. Sew on the beads in her hair.
- Make a loop from the cord and tie a knot. Glue the cord to the top of decoration to hang.

TIP: Cut a second outline of Vanellope and glue to the back for a more sturdy decoration.

- 1. Follow the flat directions.
- 2. Cut a second beige outline of Vanellope.
- 3. Make a loop from the cord and tie a knot. Set aside and remember to insert it at the top of the decoration just before stitching that area closed.
- 4. Begin to blanket stitch the front and back pieces together, leaving an opening as shown to fill the shape with cotton filler. Use a stick or pencil to push the filler into the decoration. When filled, finish stitching to complete the decoration!






Don't forget the gold cord loop for the hanger while stitching!

Bunny Pancake Decoration

To begin, print out the templates onto regular paper. Overlay the freezer paper and trace the shapes onto the matte side of the freezer paper. **TIP:** If more than one shape is the same colored felt, gang those together as you trace the shapes.

Lay the freezer paper, shiny side down onto the felt. Use a warm iron to temporarily adhere the freezer paper onto the felt. Press down for about 6 seconds or until the paper adheres to the felt. Trim out the shapes with a sharp scissor. Peel away the freezer paper from the felt.






Flat Instructions:

- 1. Cut out the outline.
- 2. Glue on the shapes in layers.
- 3. Use embroidery thread to stitch in the rabbit's mouth.
- 4. Make a loop from the cord and tie a knot. Glue the cord to the top of decoration to hang.

TIP: Cut a second outline of the rabbit and pancakes and glue to the back for a more sturdy decoration.

- 1. Follow the flat directions.
- 2. Cut a second beige outline of the rabbit and pancakes.
- 3. Make a loop from the cord and tie a knot. Set aside and remember to insert it at the top of the decoration just before stitching that area closed.
- 4. Begin to blanket stitch the front and back pieces together, leaving an opening as shown to fill the shape with cotton filler. Use a stick or pencil to push the filler into the decoration. When filled, finish stitching to complete the decoration!








Milkshake Kitty Decoration

- 2. Cut a second beige outline of the kitty and milkshake.
- 3. Make a loop from the cord and tie a knot. Set aside and remember to insert it at the top of the decoration just before stitching that area closed.
