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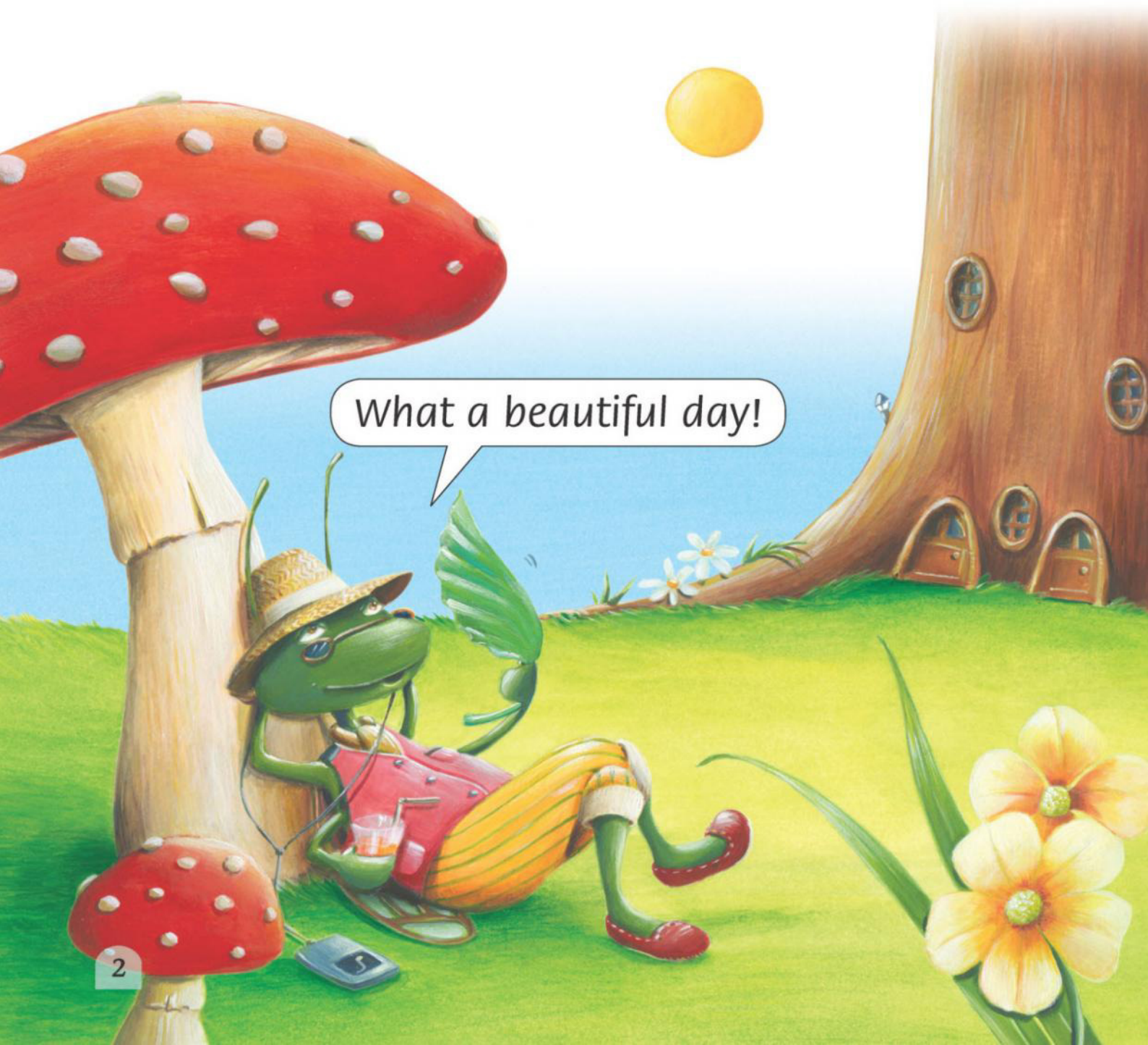
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It's summer, and it's hot.

'No, thank you,' says Ant.

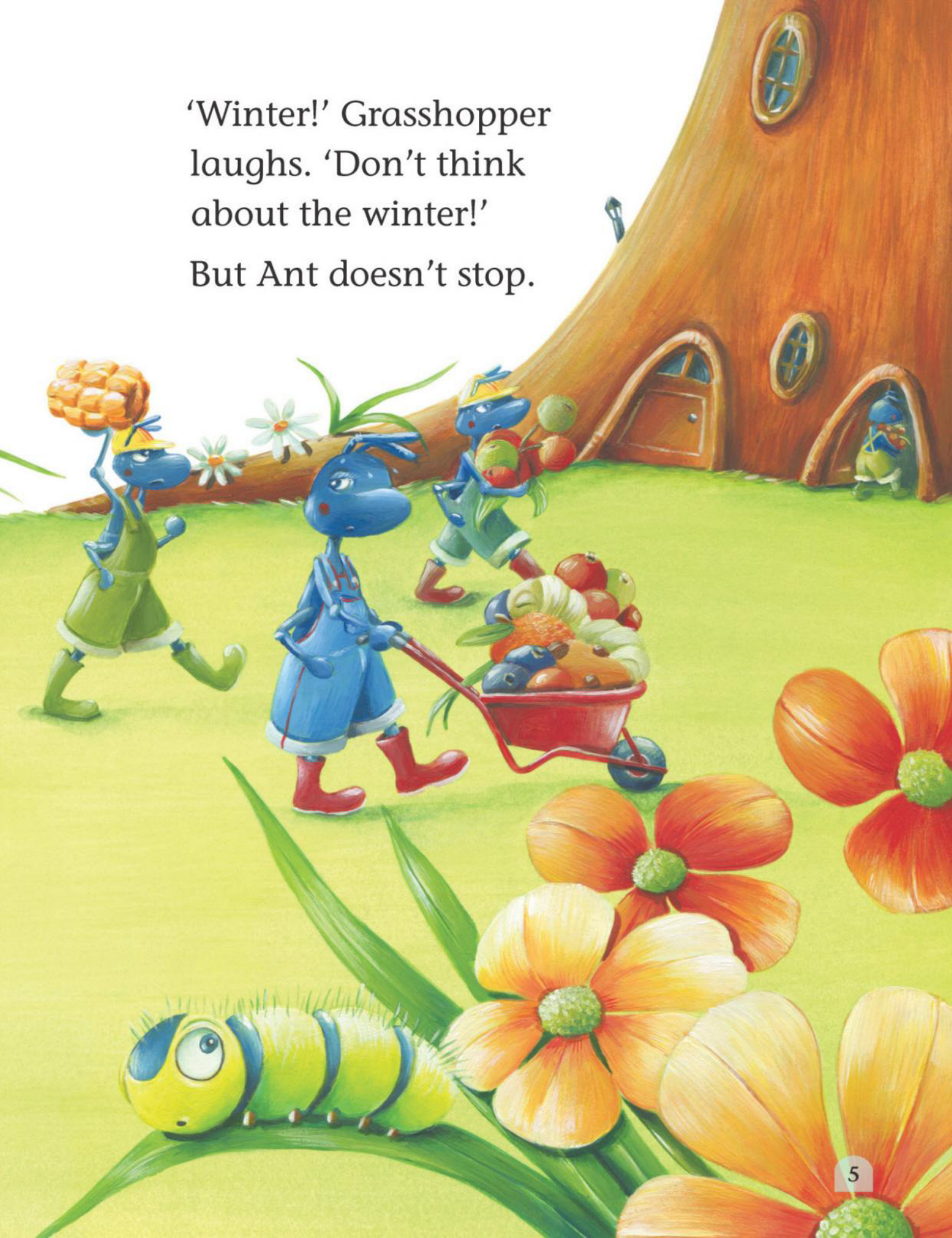
'I'm working. I'm making

All autumn the ant works.

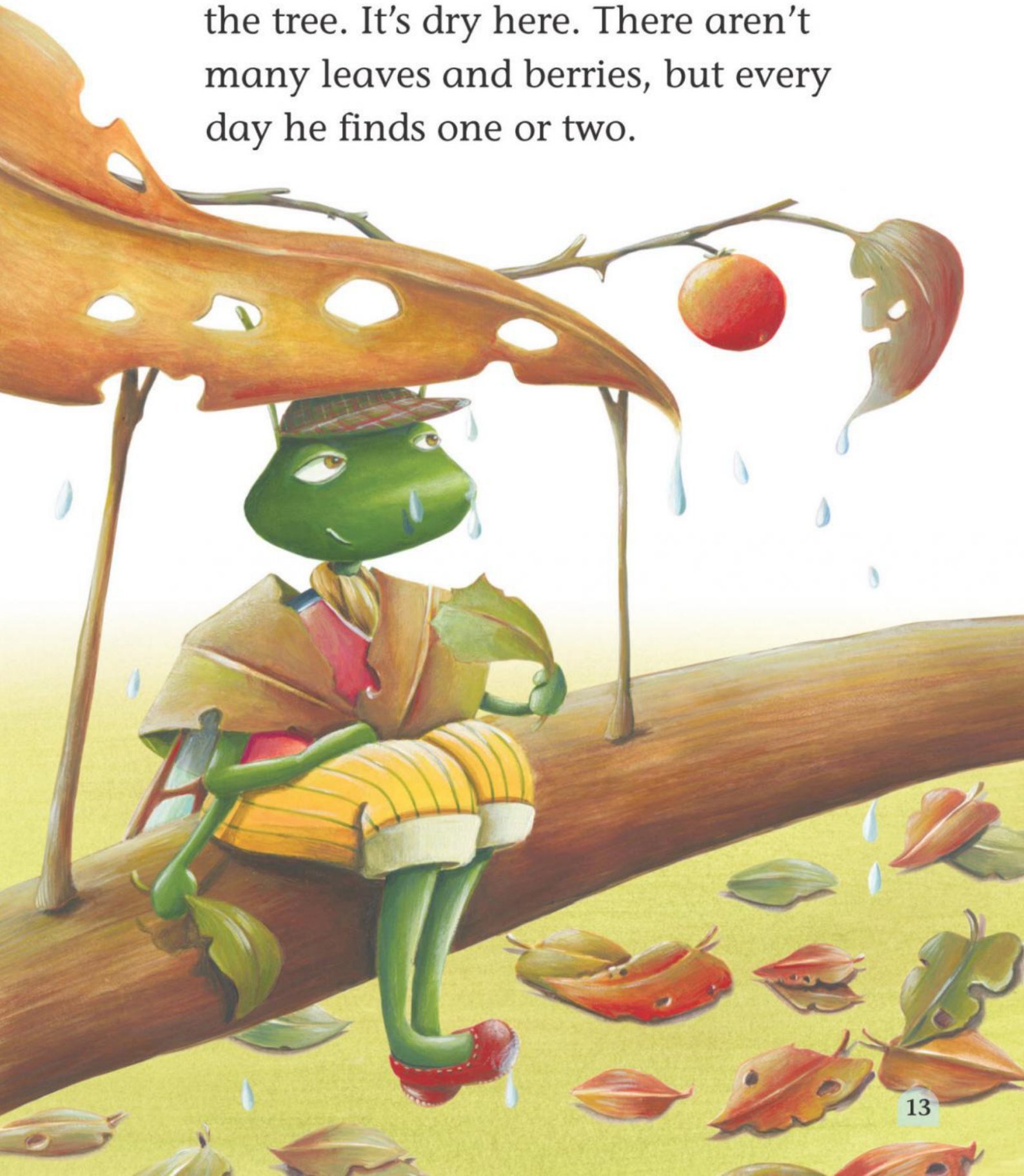

'I'm sorry, Grasshopper,' says Ant.

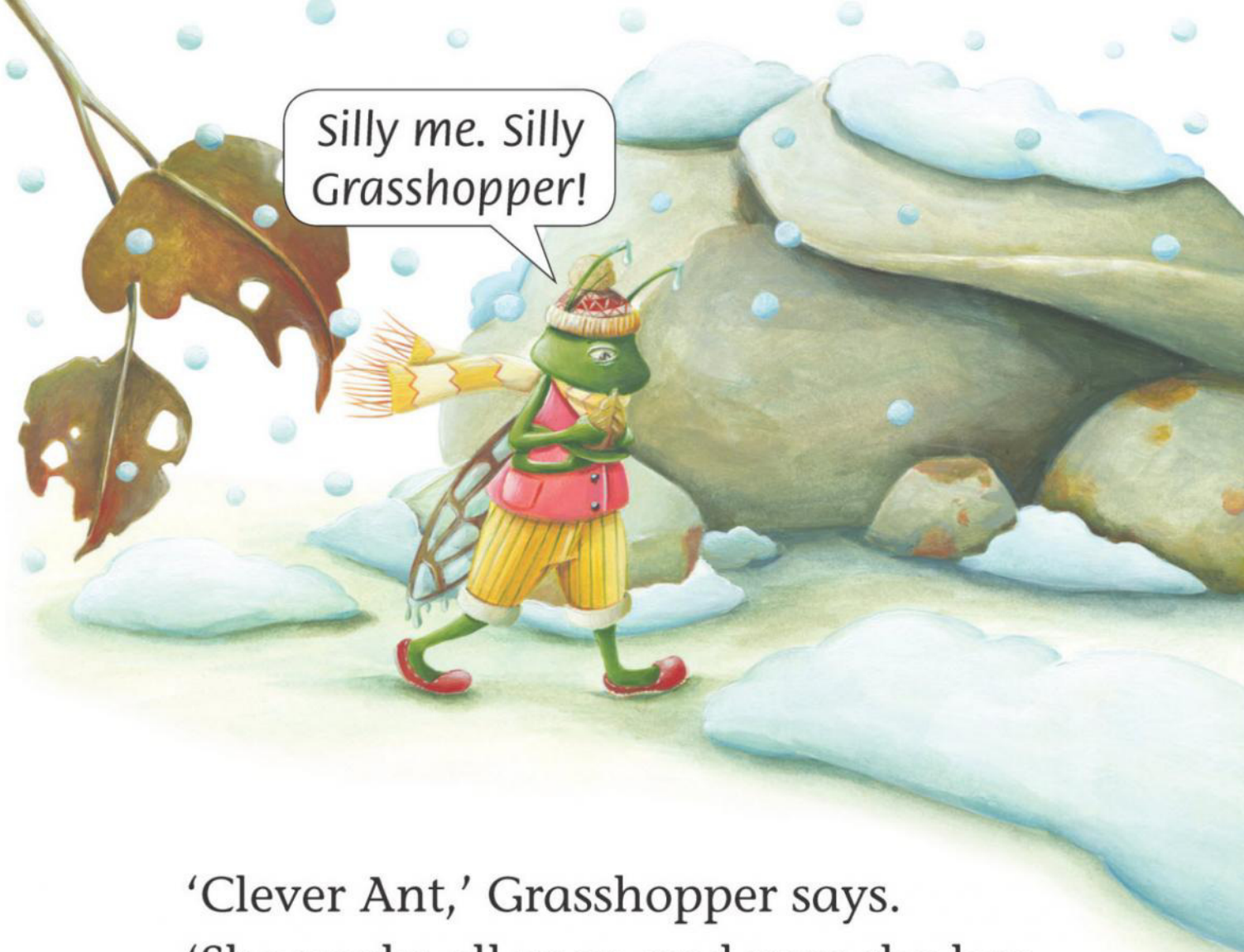
'This is my winter store. I have to eat this food all winter. I can't give you any food. Goodbye.'
