






It's summer, and it's hot. The grasshopper sits in the shade and sings.

'What a beautiful day!' says Grasshopper.











All day, Ant works. She carries food to her store. Then she goes and gets some more. She's hot and tired, but she doesn't stop.






Grasshopper sits in the shade. He sings and sleeps all day.


'Silly Ant!' he laughs. 'Don't think about your winter store. Look at me! When I'm hungry, I eat some berries or a nice leaf.'





All summer Grasshopper sits in the shade. He sings and sleeps, and he eats berries and leaves.













It's cold now, and snow comes.


