

He flies down and sits on the bucket. But the bucket falls over.


'Oh no!' says the magpie.





'Bad magpie!' the farmer says, and she catches his tail.


The magpie pulls and pulls. Oh! His tail comes off!




The magpie talks to the cow.

'Bring me some long, green grass,' says the cow. 'Then you can have some milk.'







The magpie talks to the field.

'Please give me some long, green grass for the cow. Then the farmer can have her milk. And I can have my tail.'


'Bring me some nice, cool water,' says the field. 'Then you can have some grass.'


















'Field, Field, here's your water,' he says. 'Now can I have some long, green grass?'
