











In the morning they come down.

It's the shoes!


'Look!' cries the shoemaker. 'Magic!'




He puts the shoes in the window. A lady sees them.

them. Here are three gold coins.'








He puts the shoes in the window. A man sees them.

'Now it's time for us to go. Because they know! Because they know!' say the elves. 'Goodbye, Shoemaker!'




The elves never come back. But now the shoemaker makes good shoes. He works hard.




