

But one night a toad comes.


'Mm!' says the toad. 'My son wants a wife. You can be his wife.'





Thumbelina wants to go outside. But there is always more work.

'The mole wants to marry you,' says the mouse. 'You need some new clothes.'


That evening Thumbelina looks out.
