




A piano has a total of 88 keys. These seven notes are played on the white keys, repeated over and over, but the pitch gets higher as they go from left to right.

Another hamburger is already made. It has 1 slice of tomato but you want 6 slices of tomato. How many more slices of tomato do you need?








Color And Make Your Own Tangrams
