













Telling Time to the Quarter Hour


The hour hand on a clock counts the hours 1-12. The minute hand counts the minutes 1-60. Each number on the clock stands for 5 minutes. This means that the **3** on a clock stands for 15 minutes and the **9** on a clock stands for 45 minutes.





