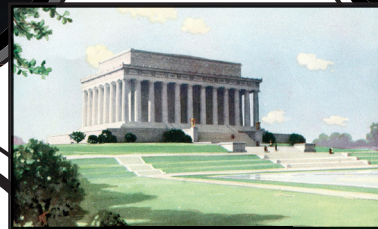
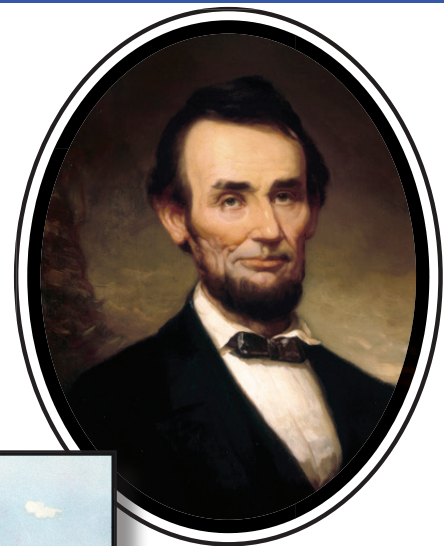
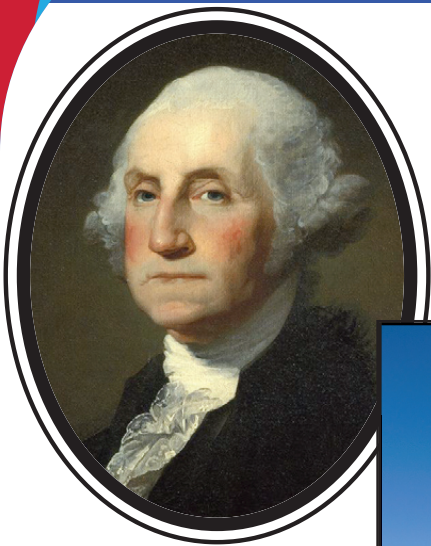


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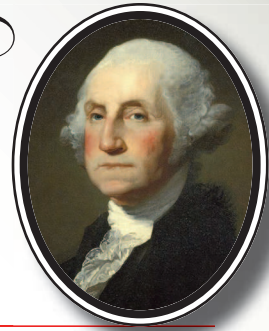
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George Washington



Finding the Facts

George Washington is known as the “Father of Our Country.” Read about George Washington to see why he was given this nickname. After you read, complete the sentences.

George Washington was born in Virginia on February 22, 1732. At this time, America was ruled by **England**. When he was a young boy, George had to travel a very long distance to get to school. To get to his first school, George had to walk seven miles each way. George studied hard and became a surveyor. A **surveyor** is someone who measures land and makes maps. George Washington’s home was a farm called **Mount Vernon**. As an adult, he married a woman named **Martha Custis**. Martha had two children, and George helped raise them. At this time, there were a lot of people living in America who did not want America to be part of England anymore. George Washington was chosen to be the **Commander in Chief of the American army**. He fought in the Revolutionary War so that America could be a separate country. After a long and difficult fight, America won the war and gained its independence from England. It became the United States of America, and George Washington was elected as the first president in 1789. At that time, the capital of the United States was New York. The capital later became Washington, D.C., named for George Washington.

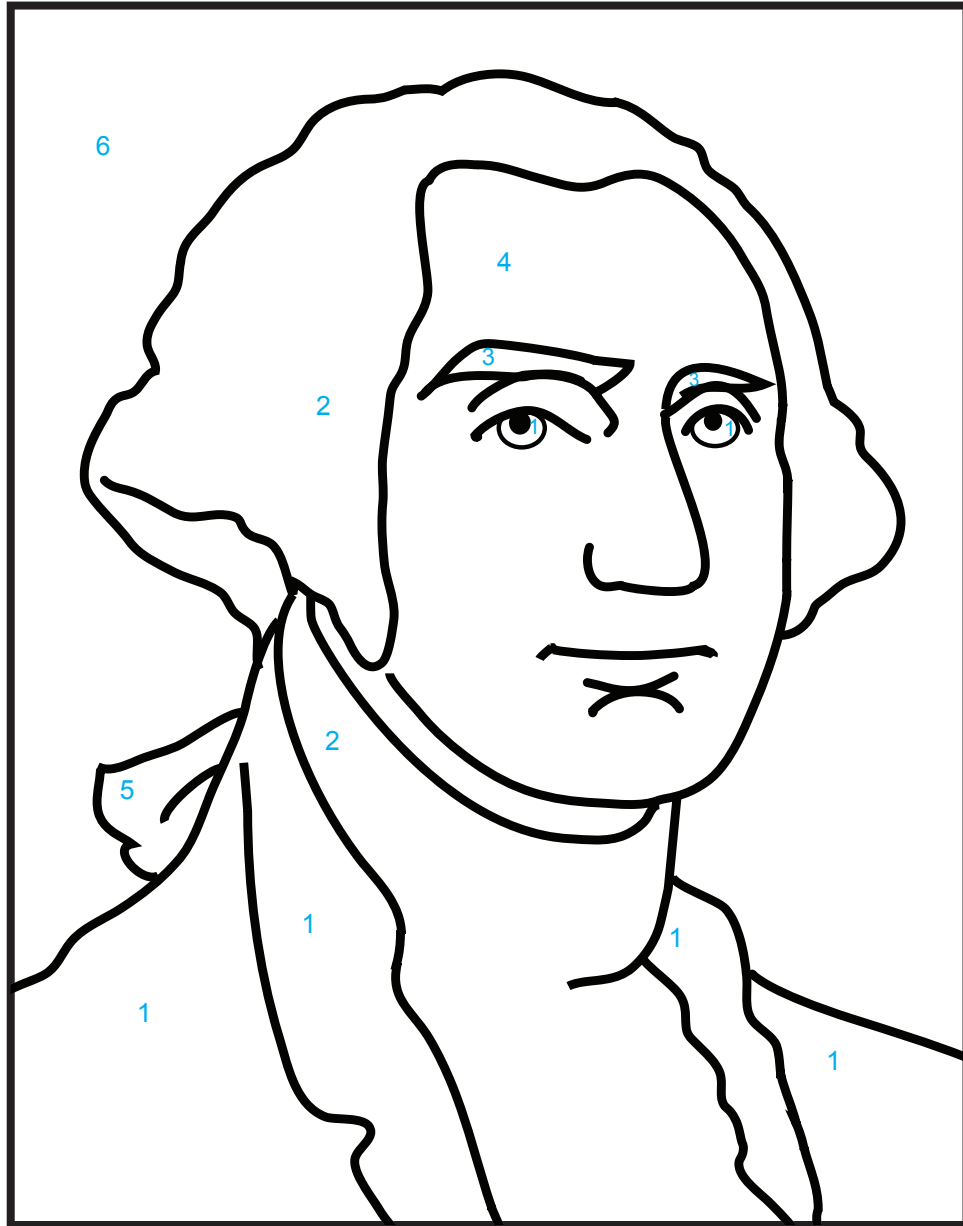

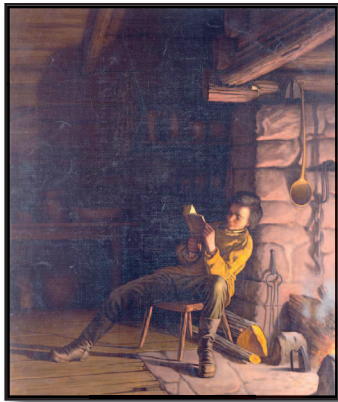


Abraham Lincoln



Finding the Facts

Abraham Lincoln was our 16th president and often called "Honest Abe." Read about Abraham Lincoln to learn why he is one of our most well-known presidents. After you read, complete the sentences.



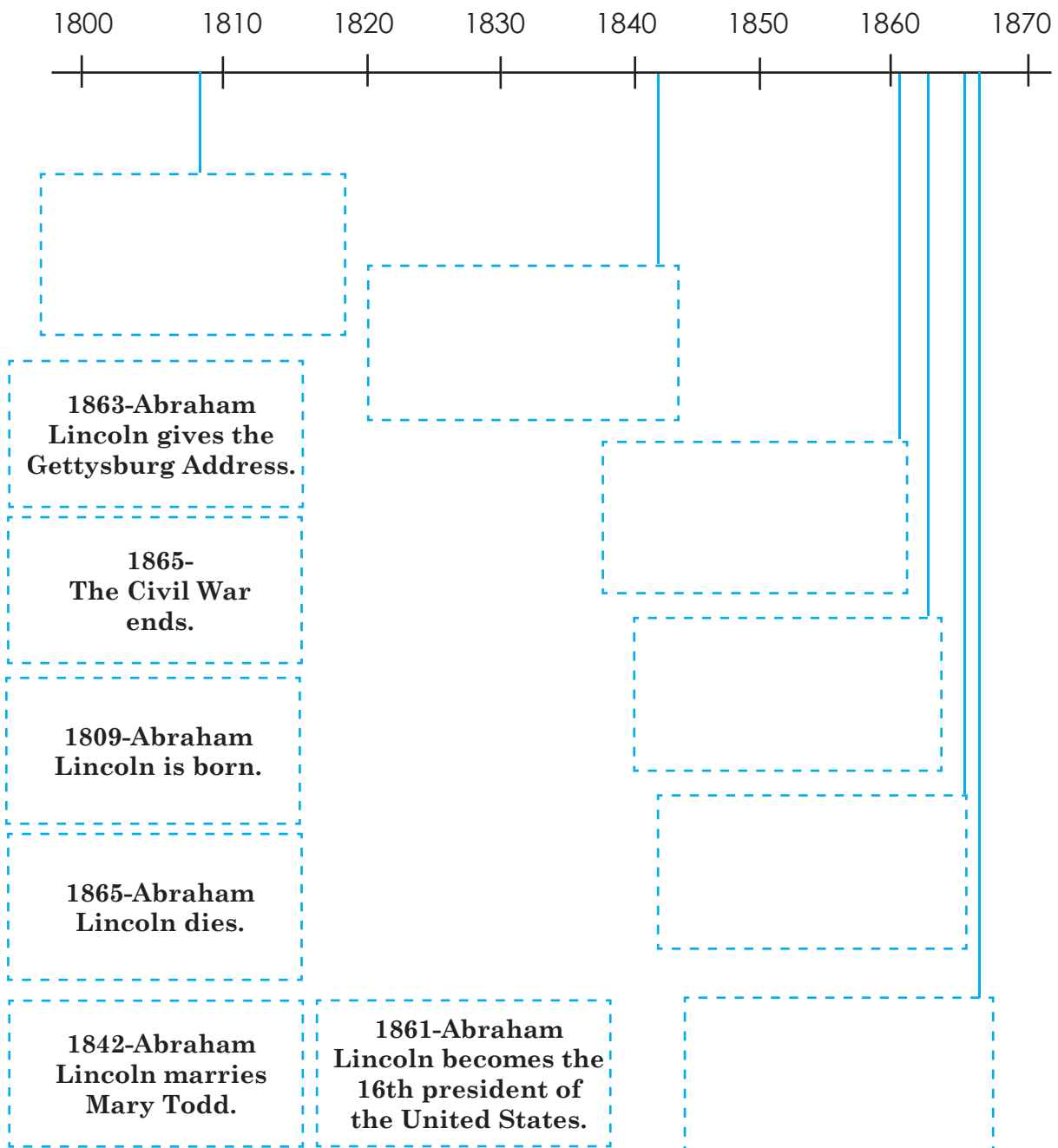
Abraham Lincoln was born in a **log cabin** in the state of Kentucky on February 12, 1809. He and his sister worked on their family farm. When his family moved to Indiana, Abe helped build the family's new home. Abe didn't get to go to school very often, but he **loved to read**, and he would walk miles to borrow books. When he grew up, Abe had many different jobs. He was a shopkeeper and a mailman. Finally, Abe decided to study law, became a **lawyer**, and moved to Springfield, Illinois. There, he married Mary Todd. Abe and Mary had four children. In 1860, Abraham Lincoln was elected to be our **16th president**. While he was president, the **Civil War** began. Our country was divided. The northern states were fighting against the southern states. During the war, Abraham Lincoln wrote the Emancipation Proclamation, which freed slaves. He also wrote a very famous speech called the Gettysburg Address. President Lincoln gave this speech to try to keep the United States together. The war lasted five years, and President Lincoln was killed just five days after the war ended. The United States had lost their president.

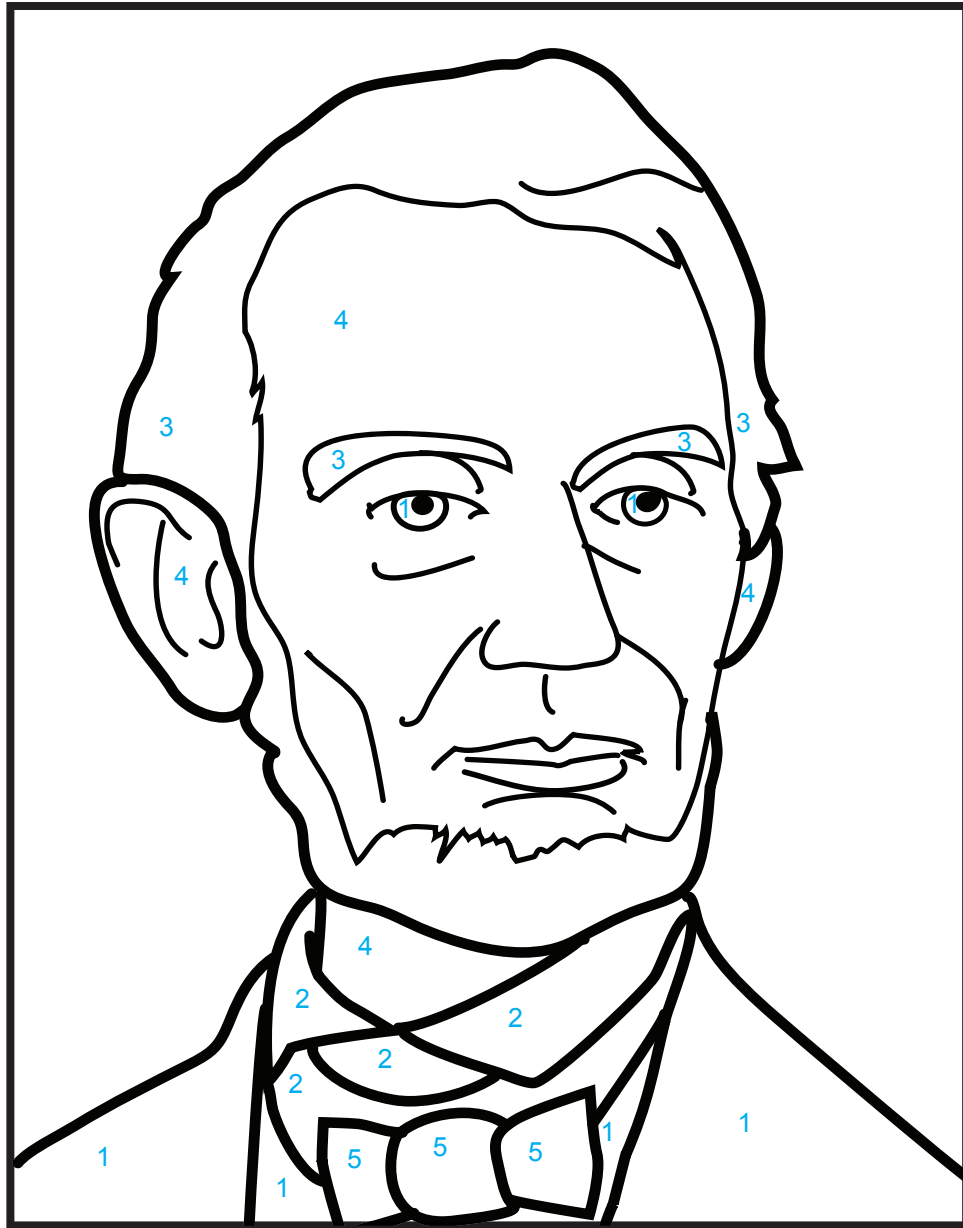

Barack Obama is the son of an African man and an American woman. His father was born in a little village in the country of Kenya. His mother was from a small town in the state of Kansas. When they met, Barack's parents were both going to college in Hawaii. Barack Obama was **born in Hawaii** on August 4, 1961. When Barack was very young, his father moved back to Kenya, and his mother raised him on her own in Hawaii and Indonesia. When he was 10 years old, Barack moved in with his grandparents. He lived with them in Hawaii, and he spent his days studying, body surfing, and playing basketball. Barack went to college in Los Angeles and New York. As time went on, he earned a law degree from Harvard. Barack Obama met **Michelle Robinson** when he was living in Chicago. They married and had two daughters, **Malia and Sasha**. Obama was a civil rights lawyer and a law professor. He served for eight years as a state senator for Illinois. Today, Barack Obama is our **44th president**, and the first **African-American president of the United States**. He was reelected to the office in November 2012 and is currently serving his second term. When he can find the time, President Obama still loves a good game of **basketball**.

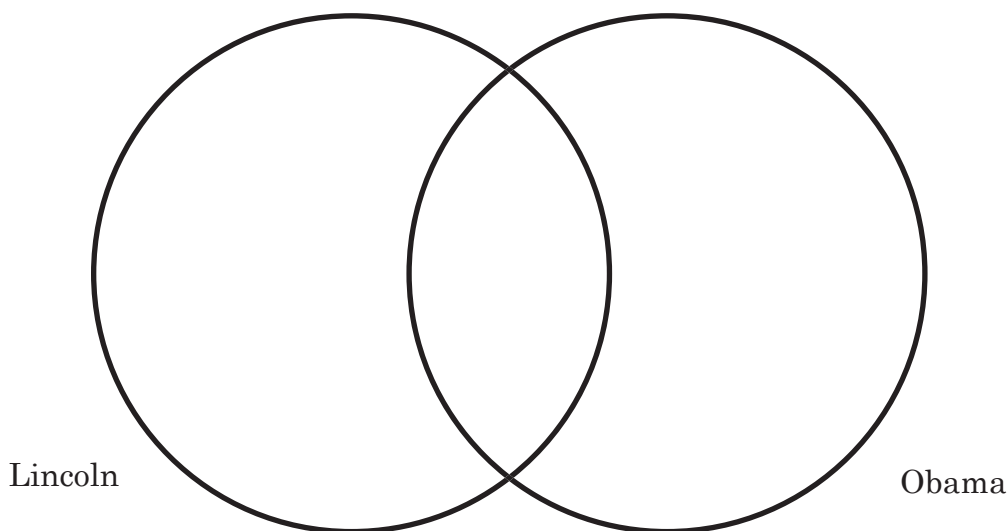
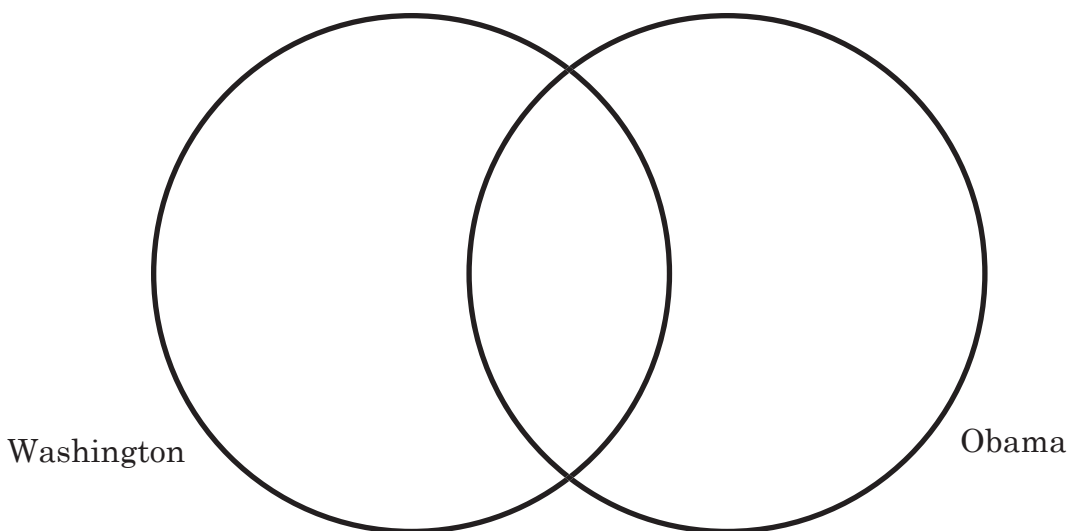
