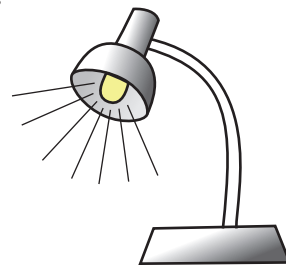
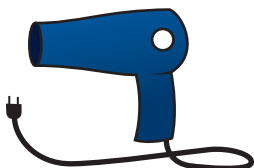
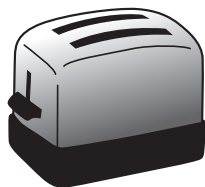

Which items made in other countries do you think could also be made in your country? What would be the advantages of having electronic items made in your country? Would there be any disadvantages?





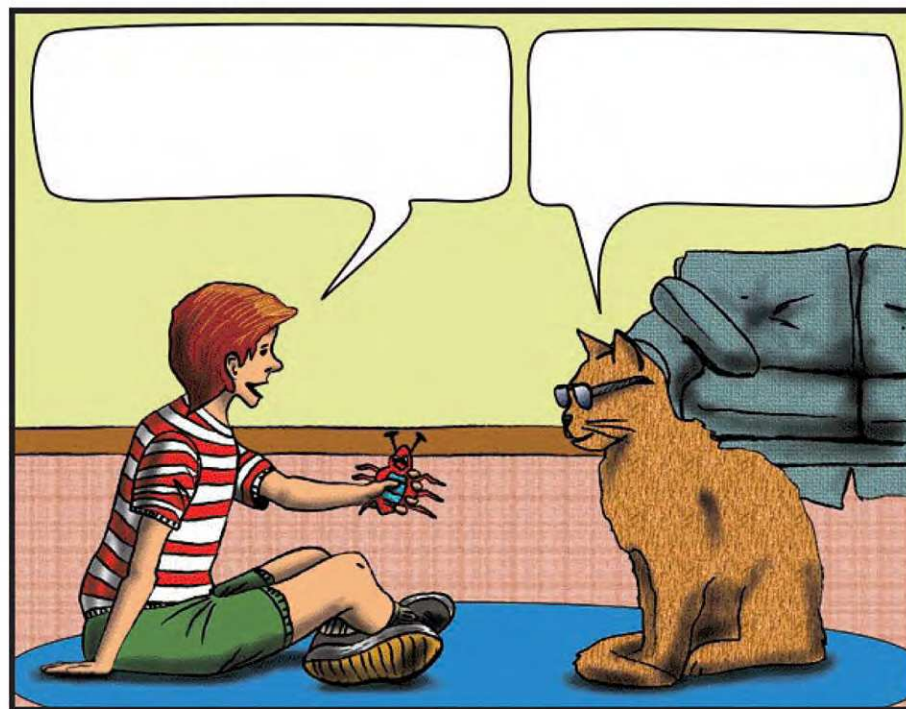
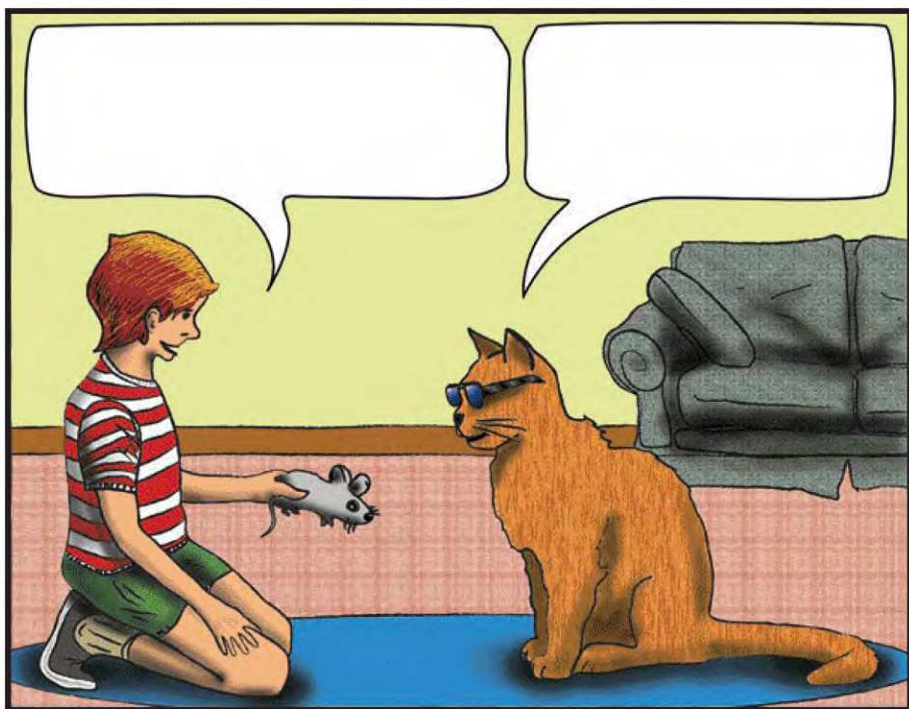

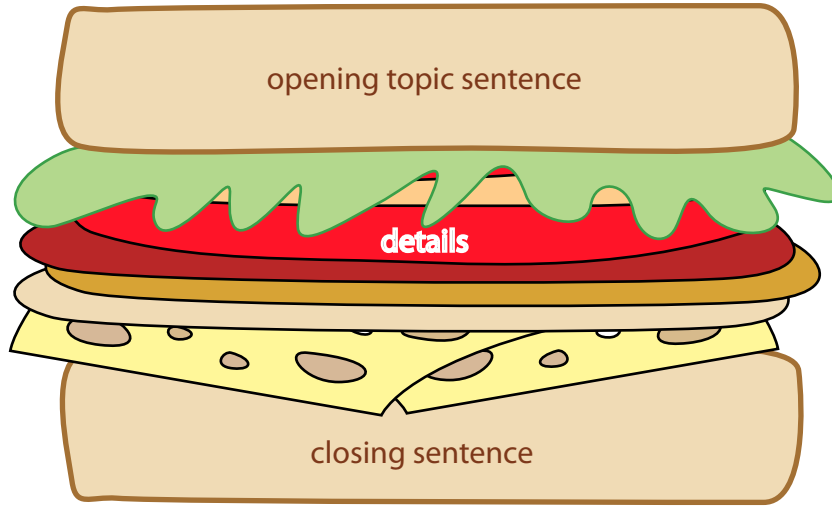


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PARAGRAPH SANDWICH

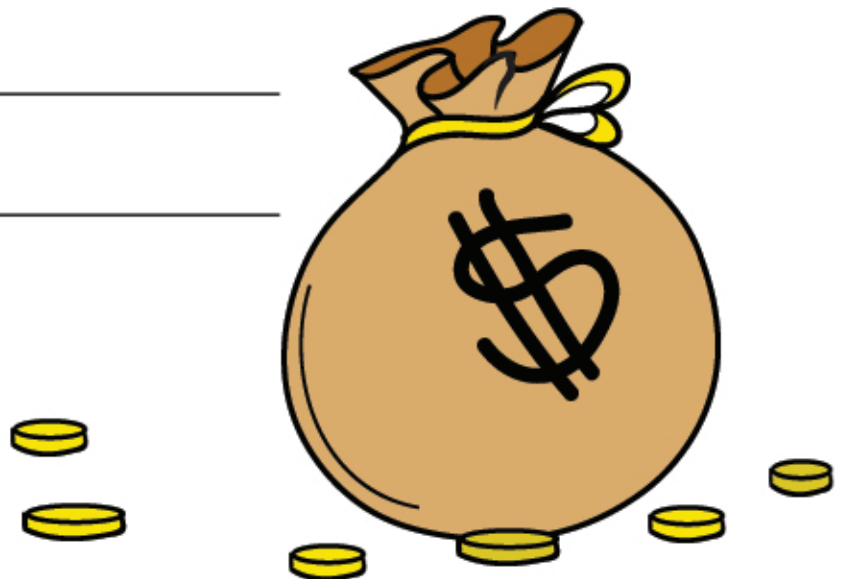

What if you had a million dollars? Write down the things you would buy, the places you would visit and the things you would do.



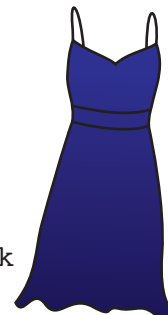
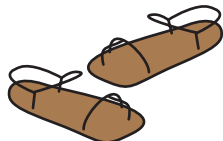

Dotty's mom says, "It's a family heirloom that my mom gave me when I graduated from high school. You can wear it when you're a little older, but not yet."



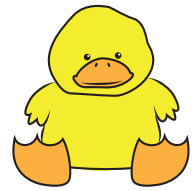
