
GAME IDEA: Give five cards to a friend and keep another five for yourself. Put the rest facedown in a pile. Instead of asking for numbers, for capital cities. In order to win the game, you can either be the first to reach a certain number of cards, the first to gather all the states that start with A, or the first to gather all the cities in a certain area of the United States.


