Tamil Nadu News

Special drone unit

- 1. The Tamil Nadu government has planned to form a special drone unit for the Greater Chennai police.
- 2. It includes nine drones including six quick response payload drones, two long-range surveillance drones and a lifeguard drone.
- 3. The drone units will be deployed at vantage points in the city to aid and assist field police officers
- 4. It aims to reduce the response time to distress calls, conduct surveillance on VIP routes and crime-prone areas.
- 5. The quick response payload drone will be a multi-rotor drone capable of interchangeable payloads.
- 6. It has an HD camera with thermal and night vision.

Kaliveli wetlands

- 1. The Government of Tamil Nadu has declared 5,151.60 hectares of swamp/wetlands in **Villupuram** district as Kazhuveli Wetland Birds Sanctuary.
- 2. The declaration was made in exercise of the power conferred in the **Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972**.
- 3. Kazhuveli or Kaliveli wetland system is one of the largest waterfowl congregation sites in Tamil Nadu.
- 4. It is a well-known raptor roosting site for species like the Eastern Imperial Eagle, Greater Spotted Eagle, Red-necked Falcon and several harriers.
- 5. A rare migratory wader named 'Grey-tailed Tattler' has been recorded here.
- 6. Kazhuveli falls in the Central Asian migratory path of birds.
- 7. It is also home to the second-largest brackish water lake in South India.
- 8. Kazhuveli will be the **16th Bird Sanctuary in Tamil Nadu**.

The Protected Areas in the State includes,

- 5 National parks,
- 15 Wildlife sanctuaries,
- o 15 bird sanctuaries and
- 2 conservation reserves
- Besides, 5 Tiger Reserves viz. Anamalai, Kalakkad Mundanthurai, Mudumalai, Sathyamangalam and Srivilliputtur Megamalai.
- Further Tamil Nadu also have 3 Biosphere Reserves viz. Nilgiris, Gulf of Mannar and Agasthiarmalai.

Ujjwala 2.0 scheme in TN

- 1. Under the Ujjwala 2.0 scheme, 1.74 lakh free liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) connections have been provided in the State.
- 2. A total of 32.43 lakh beneficiaries were covered in the first phase of the Ujjwala scheme in Tamil Nadu.
- 3. The state uses the Aadhaar and family card databases and correlate it with the 2011 Census data to ensure maximum coverage.



Ujjwala 2.0

- It was launched in April 2021.
- It provides LPG connections to households under various categories.
- Beneficiaries includes island dwellers, SC/ST, most backward classes, forest dwellers, tea and ex-tea garden tribes.
- These houses should not possess any other LPG connection.
- The households should have some document such as family card or Aadhaar card and have a bank account linked to the Aadhaar.
- The beneficiaries would get a gas stove, Suraksha safety hose, regulator and one LPG cylinder for free.

Initials in Tamil

- 1. The Government of Tamil Nadu has issued an order making it mandatory for students to write the initials of their names in Tamil.
- 2. It is to be followed while applying for certificates in schools and colleges.
- 3. It would also apply to members of the public when they submit applications for government records.
- 4. The first letter of the parent's name as written in Tamil would be the initial of the applicant.
- 5. The State government already made it compulsory for its employees to sign their name and initials in Tamil.

Isai Perarignar Award

- 1. Nagaswaram player **Seshampatti T. Sivalingam** will receive the Isai Perarignar Award of the Tamil Isai Sangam on the occasion of its 79th music festival.
- 2. The Pann Isai Perarignar Award is announced for **Aalavai Pon. M. Muthukumaran**.
- 3. Mr. Sivalingam had already received the TTK Award of the Music Academy, the Sangeetha Nataka Academy Award and the Kalaimamani Award.

India's first woman psychiatrist

- 1. **Sarada Menon** who was the longest-serving head of the Institute of Mental Health, died in Chennai.
- 2. She did her psychiatry training at the National Institute of Mental Health and Neuro Sciences in Bengaluru.
- 3. She is the country's first woman psychiatrist and was honoured with Padma Bhushan in 1992.
- 4. She founded the Schizophrenia Research Foundation (SCARF India) in 1984 along with psychiatrist R. Thara.



National

Delhi-Dehradun Economic Corridor

- 1. PM Modi inaugurated multiple projects worth Rs 18,000 crore in Uttarakhand recently.
- 2. This includes the Delhi-Dehradun Economic Corridor which will be built at a cost of around 8,300 crore rupees.
- 3. It will significantly reduce the travel time from Delhi to Dehradun from six hours to around 2.5 hours.
- 4. It will have **Asia's largest wildlife elevated corridor** of 12 kilometres for unrestricted wildlife movement.
- 5. Prime Minister said that India's policy today is of 'Gatishakti', to work twice or thrice as fast.

India's Largest Manufacturing Hub

- 1. Gujarat has pipped Maharashtra to emerge the largest manufacturing hub in the country.
- 2. Gujarat's Gross Value Addition (GVA) in manufacturing growing 15.9 per cent annually on average between FY12 and FY20.
- 3. The data was released by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI).
- 4. Maharashtra's annual growth rate during the period was 7.5 per cent per annum.
- 5. It continues to lead as the nation's biggest services hub.
- 6. The other states with the highest manufacturing GVA were Tamil Nadu, Karnataka and Uttar Pradesh.
- 7. The worst performers among states, which were already among the top 10 manufacturing ones during the period, were Rajasthan, Telangana and Andhra Pradesh.

RBI Monetary Policy

- 1. Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) of RBI has kept the repo rate unchanged at 4 per cent for the ninth consecutive time
- 2. The MPC is headed by Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Governor Shaktikanta Das.
- 3. The Marginal Standing Facility (MSF) rate and bank rates remain unchanged.
- o Policy Repo Rate: 4.00% o Reverse Repo Rate: 3.35%
- o Marginal Standing Facility Rate: 4.25%
- o Bank Rate: 4.25%
- o CRR: 4% o SLR: 18.00%



'She is a Changemaker' Programme

- 1. It is a a pan-India capacity building programme launched by National Commission for Women.
- 2. It is launched for women representatives at all levels, gram panchayats to parliament members and political workers including office bearers of National/State political parties.
- 3. The programme was launched by Ms Rekha Sharma, Chairperson of the National Commission for Women.
- 4. It aims to improve leadership skills of grassroots women political leaders.

National Commission for Women:

- It was set up as a statutory body in January 1992.
- o It was established under the National Commission for Women Act, 1990

e-Sawari India E-Bus Coalition

- 1. NITI Aayog has announced the 'E-Sawaari India Electric Bus Coalition'.
- 2. It is in partnership with Convergence Energy Service Ltd (CESL) and World Resources Institute, India (WRI India), with the support from Transformative Urban Mobility Initiative (TUMI).
- 3. It aims to share knowledge and learnings on the e-bus adoption in India among several stakeholders.
- 4. The electrification of public transport is key to India's decarbonisation strategy.
- 5. This Coalition is a step toward ensuring steady and paced electrification of the bus transport system in India.

InFinity Forum

- 1. Prime Minister Modi virtually inaugurated a thought leadership forum on FinTech, 'InFinity Forum'.
- 2. The event was hosted by International Financial Services Centres Authority (IFSCA) in collaboration with GIFT City and Bloomberg.
- 3. Indonesia, South Africa and the United Kingdom were the partner countries in the 1st edition of the Forum.
- 4. It is an event with a focus on aspects relating to FinTech and using it for inclusive growth.
- 5. The InFinity Forum had a theme named 'Beyond.'



International

Clean Energy and Climate Partnership

- 1. India and European Union (EU) jointly agreed to implement the 2016 India-EU Clean Energy and Climate Partnership.
- 2. The Panel agreed on increased technical cooperation in energy efficiency, renewable energy, green hydrogen, grid integration, storage, power market design, interconnection, cold chain, and sustainable financing.
- 3. The Panel also agreed to explore further avenues to strengthen India-EU cooperation in the context of the International Solar Alliance.
- 4. EU expressed its support for the close cooperation between India and the International Energy Agency.

Gambia's President

- 1. Adama Barrow won a second term as President in the Gambia's presidential election.
- 2. He won by achieving over 53% votes from 50 of 53 constituencies.
- 3. The previous presidentship of Adama Barrow ended the 20 year long dictatorship of former Yahya Jammeh.

Sunil Arora invited to join IDEA

- 1. Former chief election commissioner (CEC) **Sunil Arora** has been invited to join the board of advisers at the International Institute for Democracy and Electoral Assistance, also known as International IDEA.
- 2. Mr. Arora was India's 23rd Chief Election Commissioner.
- 3. IDEA was established in 1995. It is an intergovernmental organization based in Stockholm, Sweden.
- 4. The institute is assisted by a 15-member board of advisers who are eminent personalities or experts from a wide variety of backgrounds
- 5. It is an organisation that support sustainable democracy worldwide.
- 6. It has 34 member countries which include large and small, older and newer democracies from all continents.
- 7. India was one of the founding members of IDEA.

Beijing Winter Olympics

- 1. The United States has announced that US officials will not attend the 2022 Winter Olympics in Beijing.
- 2. It was after China pledged unspecified "countermeasures" against any such diplomatic boycott.
- 3. The US cited that "China's human rights ATROCITIES" is the main reason for its boycott.
- 4. The US has named the boycott as "Diplomatic Boycott".
- 5. It means that the US is not sending any official or diplomatic representation to participate in the Olympics.
- 6. However, the US is allowing American athletes to participate in the Olympics.



India-Russia Summit 2021

- 1. Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Russian President Vladimir Putin held the 21st India-Russia Annual Summit.
- 2. 28 agreements were signed in different sectors including trade, energy, science and technology, intellectual property, etc.
- 3. The leaders discussed on International North-South Transport Corridor and the Chennai Vladivostok Eastern Maritime Corridor.
- 4. The first ever India Russia **2 plus 2 Ministerial Dialogue** was held in New Delhi the before day.
- 5. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and External Affairs Minister Dr. S Jaishankar represented the Indian side in the 2 plus 2 Dialogue and the Russian side was represented by their Foreign Affairs Minister and Defence Minister.
- 6. Both India and Russia are currently developing fifth-generation Fighter Aircraft and Multi-Role Transport Aircraft.

5th Indian Ocean Conference

- 1. The 5th Indian Ocean Conference was held in Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates (UAE).
- 2. The theme of the conference was 'Indian Ocean: Ecology, Economy, Epidemic'.
- 3. The event is organised by the India foundation and is chaired by Sri Lankan President, Gotabaya Rajapaksa.
- 4. This year the conference is dealing with the challenges faced by the Indian ocean, due to the effects of the pandemic, economic decline and climate change.
- 5. Addressing the event, Dr. S Jaishankar highlighted China's growing power in the region.



Defence

Sandhayak

- 1. Indian shipbuilder Garden Reach Shipbuilders & Engineers (GRSE) has launches first large survey vessel Sandhayak for Indian Navy.
- 2. The vessel is the first in the series of four ships being built under the Survey Vessel Large (SVL) project.
- 3. In October 2018, the Indian Ministry of Defence and GRSE signed the contract to build the four survey ships.
- 4. Over 80% of the vessel is indigenous content by cost, the ships are fully designed by GRSE.
- 5. They are being built using 'Integrated Construction' concepts.

Exercise EKUVERIN

- 1. The military exercise EKUVERIN-21 between India and Maldives, held at Kadhdhoo Island, **Maldives**.
- 2. The exercise enhances synergy and inter-operability between the Armed Forces.
- 3. The joint military excercise will also include cultural and sports activities to enhance defence cooperation and bilateral relations.

President's Standard Award

- 1. President's Standard award was presented to 22nd **Missile Vessels Squadron** of Indian Navy.
- 2. The squadron is being awarded in 2021 as this year marks the 50th anniversary of India's victory in the 1971 war.
- 3. It is being celebrated across the country as **Swarnim Vijay Varsh**.
- 4. The Missile Vessels Squadron has been a part of Operation Vijay, Operation Parakram, etc.
- 5. The President's Standard Award is the highest honour awarded in military in recognition of the service rendered to the nation.
- 6. It is presented by the President of India.
- 7. The pride of the honour is equivalent to that of President's Colours awards.



Science & Technology

Digital twin platform

- 1. A pan India program to make the Digital Twin of the entire Urban India is launched by the Genesys International.
- 2. The launch programme was inaugurated by Amitabh Kant, CEO, NITI Aayog.
- 3. The creation of this very accurate 3D data will mean a host of applications would open up in high-definition mapping.
- 4. It will aid the smart cars, e-commerce, logistics, gaming, utilities planning for nextgeneration networks in telecom, etc.

The Assisted Reproductive Technology (Regulation) Bill, 2021

- 1. The Rajya Sabha recently passed the Assisted Reproductive Technology (Regulation) Bill, 2021.
- 2. The bill seeks to set standards and codes of conduct for fertility clinics and sperm banks in the country, prevent misuse as well as adopt safe and ethical practices.
- 3. The Bill proposed to set up an ART bank to regulate/ensure the supply of sperm or semen, oocytes, or oocyte donors to ART clinics for their patients.
- 4. Women above the legal age of marriage and below 50 and men above the legal age of marriage and below 55 can avail the services.
- 5. To regulate the services offered by the clinics, a national board, a national registry and a registration authority.

IXPE

- 1. US space agency NASA launched its Imaging X-ray Polarimetry Explorer (IXPE) mission.
- 2. SpaceX's Falcon 9 rocket carried away the mission spacecraft from NASA's Kennedy Space Center in Florida.
- 3. It is a joint effort of NASA with the Italian Space Agency.
- 4. The IXPE observatory is NASA's first mission dedicated to measuring the polarization of X-rays from the most extreme and mysterious objects in the universe.
- 5. The objects of study by this observatory are supernova remnants, supermassive black holes, and dozens of other high-energy objects.



Appointments

New German chancellor

- 1. Olaf Scholz, a Social Democrat was elected as the new chancellor by the German lawmakers.
- 2. It puts an end to 16 years of conservative rule of Angela Merkel.
- 3. Scholz previously served as vice-chancellor and finance minister during the Merkel administration.

- 1. **Mr Sanjiv Mehta** will be appointed as the President of Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FICCI).
- 2. Mr Mehta, currently, the Senior Vice President of FICCI, will be succeeding Mr Uday Shankar, the current President of FICCI.
- 3. Currently Mr Sanjiv Mehta is the Chairman and Managing Director, Hindustan Unilever Limited (HUL).

- 1. The Government of India has appointed **Alka Upadhyaya** as chairperson of the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI).
- 2. Upadhyaya is currently Additional Secretary in the Department of Rural Development.
- 3. **Sanjay Bandopadhyay**, has been named as the chairman of Inland Waterways Authority of India.
- 4. **Sundeep Kumar Nayak** has been appointed as Director-General, National Productivity Council, Department for Promotion of Industry & Internal Trade.



Important Days

International Volunteer Day

- 1. It is celebrated on 5 December 2021.
- 2. It is also called International Volunteer Day for Economic and Social Development.
- 3. The theme for 2021 is "Volunteer now for our common future".
- 4. It is to celebrate the efforts of volunteers and organizations and offer the opportunity to promote volunteerism.
- 5. The day was first observed and mandated by the UN General Assembly in 1985.

World Soil Day

- 1. The World Soil Day observed on **5 December** every year.
- 2. It is observed to raise awareness of the importance of soil quality for human well-being, food security and ecosystems.
- 3. Its campaign is "Halt soil salinization, boost soil productivity".
- 4. The FAO Conference unanimously endorsed World Soil Day in June 2013.
- 5. In December 2013 the UN General Assembly responded by designating 5 December 2014 as the first official World Soil Day.

Food and Agriculture Organisation

- It is headquartered in Rome, Italy.
- It is headed by Qu Dongyu.

Mahaparinirvan Divas

- 1. India observes **December 6** as Mahaparinirvan Divas every year to mark the death anniversary of Dr Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar.
- 2. He fought for the economic and social empowerment of Dalits in the country.
- 3. He was popularly known as Babasaheb Ambedkar passed away on December 6, 1956.
- 4. The Union government has decided to celebrate Mahaparinirvan Divas as part of the major commemoration of 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav.
- 5. Ambedkar was posthumously conferred with the Bharat Ratna, India's highest civilian award.

International Civil Aviation Day

- 1. International Civil Aviation Day is celebrated every year on **December 7**.
- 2. It is to recognize the importance of aviation to the social and economic development of the world.
- 3. The theme of the day is "Advancing Innovation for Global Aviation Development".

International Civil Aviation Organization

- Headquarter: Montreal, Canada.
- President: Salvatore Sciacchitano.

SAARC Charter Day

- 1. The South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (SAARC) Charter Day is observed annually on **8th December**.
- 2. It is to commemorate the adoption of the SAARC Charter.
- 3. The year 2021 marks the 37th anniversary of the regional group.
- 4. The charter was signed by the Leaders of Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Maldives, Nepal, Pakistan and Sri Lanka.



5. The First SAARC Summit held in Dhaka, Bangladesh.

International Anti-Corruption Day

- 1. It is observed annually on **9 December** to raise public awareness for anti-corruption.
- 2. The day is observed since the passage of the United Nations Convention Against Corruption on 31 October 2003.
- 3. The theme of the Day 2021 is "Your right, your role: say no to corruption".
- 4. It seeks to highlight the rights and responsibilities of everyone including States, Government officials, etc. in tackling corruption.



Awards

"Young Geospatial Scientist" Award

- 1. Ropesh Goyal from IIT-Kanpur won the 'Young Geospatial Scientist' award.
- 2. It is in recognition of his unique contribution to developing the Indian Geoid Model and computation software.
- 3. It was awarded during the event of the DigiSmart India 2021 conference hosted by the Geospatial World.
- 4. The award is to promising scientists below 35 years of age in memory of Rachapudi Kamakshi, a strategic analyst with a strong inclination towards geography and geospatial studies.

UNESCO heritage awards

- 1. Nizamuddin Basti project wins two UNESCO heritage awards
- 2. It is a project on holistic urban revitalisation of the historic Nizamuddin Basti community in Delhi.
- 3. The project won in two categories in this year's UNESCO Asia-Pacific Awards for Cultural Heritage Conservation.
- 4. It has bagged the prestigious Award of Excellence and also won the Special Recognition for Sustainable Development category.
- 5. Nine projects from six countries Bangladesh, China, India, Japan, Malaysia, and Thailand have been honoured by a jury of heritage experts.

Ciprian Foias Award

- 1. Indian-origin mathematician Prof. Nikhil Srivastava has been jointly selected for the inaugural Ciprian Foias Prize by American Mathematical Society (AMS).
- 2. Prof. Srivastava will receive the prize along with Prof. Adam Marcus and Prof. Daniel Spielman.
- 3. The award recognises their highly original work that introduced and developed methods for understanding the characteristic polynomial of matrices.
- 4. Prof. Srivastava has also won the George Polya Prize in 2014 and the Held prize in 2021.
- 5. The prize will be presented on January 5, 2022 at the Joint Mathematics Meeting in Seattle.
- 6. This is described as "the largest mathematics gathering in the world."

Jnanpith Award

- 1. Konkani novelist and short story writer **Damodar Mauzo** won the 57th Jnanpith Award.
- 2. Assamese poet **Nilmani Phookan Jr** won the 56th Jnanpith Award.
- 3. The Jnanpith Award is the oldest and the highest Indian literary award.
- 4. It is presented annually by the Bharatiya Jnanpith to an author for their "outstanding contribution towards literature."
- 5. It was instituted in 1961.
- 6. The award is bestowed only on Indian writers writing in Indian languages included in the Eighth Schedule to the Constitution of India and English, with no posthumous conferral.

Ajaz Patel

- 1. Ajaz Patel of New Zealand is the 3rd cricketer to take 10 Wickets in an Innings.
- 2. England bowler Jim Laker had taken 10 wickets in an innings against Australia in 1956.
- 3. India's Anil Kumble also took 10 wickets against Pakistan in 1999 at the Feroz Shah Kotla in New Delhi.

Saudi Arabian GP

- 1. Mercedes driver **Lewis Hamilton** (Britain) won the inaugural edition of the Saudi Arabian Grand Prix (GP),
- 2. He surpassed Max Verstappen (Netherlands) in the event held at the coastal resort area in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia.

BWF Player of the Year

- 1. Viktor Axelsen of Denmark was named Male player of the year 2021.
- 2. China's Taipei's Tai Tzu Ying was named the Female player of the year 2021 by the Badminton World Federation (BWF).
