It is being developed by DLF Cyber City Developers Ltd (DCCDL) with an investment of Rs 5,000 crore. Once DLF Downtown is completed and operational, DLF will have a footprint of about 14 million square

feet of commercial workspaces in the city, making it the second-largest market after Gurugram.

Selection committee consisting of:

- 1) State Chief Minister,
- 2) Speaker of Legislative Assembly,
- 3) Leader of Opposition or leader of largest opposition party in State Legislature,
- 4) Chairman of Legislative Council and
- 5) Leader of Opposition of Legislative Council

Advanced robotic surgery center

- An advanced robotic surgery centre has been set up at the Tamil Nadu Government Multi Super Speciality Hospital (TNGMSSH), **Omandurar**.
- A Rs. 35-crore worth equipment for robotic surgery was installed and a fully modular operation theatre has been readied at a cost of Rs. 50 lakh.
- Except for Central government institutions such as Jipmer, no State government hospital has such a centre.
- Advanced centres would help in the treatment of cancers.

Taking Thirukkural abroad

• Constantine **Joseph Beschi**, the Italy born Jesuit preist known by his Tamil name **Veeramamunivar**, was the first person to translate Thirukkural into a European language. He translated Arathupal and Porutpal of thirukkural into latin in the early 18th century.

- Lieutenant Colonel William Lambton began to work on April 10th 1802.

Population Census Rules

 The Centre amended Census Rules, 1990 for the upcoming Census and National Population Register (NPR).

What are the key changes?

- To include "electronic form" and "self-enumeration" in the schedule of questions to be asked during census enumeration.
- Self-enumeration' means filling-up, completion and submission of census schedule by respondents themselves.
- Gives powers to the enumerator to ask questions regarding the Census and makes it obligatory for respondents to answer, with certain exception s
- "Electronic form shall have the same meaning as assigned to it in clause (r) of sub-section (1) of section 2 of the Information Technology Act, 2000 (21 of 2000)."
- In Rule 5, which also deals with publishing Census statistics through publications of magnetic media, the word "media" has been replaced with "electronic or any other media".
- Rule 8 has an addition: "print media, electronic media, social media", to the list of modes for ensuring wide publicity for the exercise. The earlier list only included radio, audio-visuals and posters

Biological and Toxin Weapons Convention (BTWC)

- India at UNSC proposed to ensure full and effective implementation of the Biological and Toxin Weapons Convention (BTWC) in a letter and spirit.
- It has made statement after emerging reports of biological activities relating to Ukraine.

India's Permanent Representative to the United Nations - T.S. Tirumurti

Biological and Toxin Weapons Convention (BTWC)

It is a treaty that prohibits the development, production, acquisition, transfer, stockpiling, and use of biological weapons.

The treaty came into force in 1975.

The treaty prohibiting bioweapons has 183 signatories, including the United States, Russia, and Ukraine

AK 203 and Sig sauer 716

- Due to the ongoing crisis in Ukraine, implementation of the deal for 6.1 lakh Ak-203 assault rifles signed with Russia will be delayed.
- Over 6.1 lakh Ak-203 assault rifles will be manufactured by a Joint Venture, Indo-Russian Rifles Private Ltd (IRRPL), at **Korwa, Amethi in Uttar Pradesh.**



• Also procurement of 72,400 SIG-716 assault rifles from Sig Sauer (USA) is likely to be dropped, due to delay in delivery.

Drone Rules 2021:

With the intention to liberalise policy regimes for Drones, the Drone Rules 2021 was introduced with the due suspension of the earlier existing Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS) Rules, notified in March 2021. The Drone Rules were issued by the Ministry of Civil Aviation on August 26, 2021. The rules are said to be built on the premise of trust, self-certification and non-intrusive monitoring.

SIKHS - KIRPAN

- The Bureau of Civil Aviation Security revoked its order of restricting Sikh employees working at airports from carrying kirpans.
- According to an initial internal order, all Sikh employees working at the airports were restricted to carry kirpans to work (airport).
- The para restricting entry of Sikh employees inside the airport carrying kirpan of specified size has been deleted.



Kirpan:

Kirpans is a religious curved dagger.

It was part of a religious decree issued by Guru Gobind Singh in 1699.

The word kirban in the Punjabi word has two roots. Kiruba means "grace" and Ann means "respect" or "dignity".

5 k's of Sikhs:

A person following Sikhism has to carry the following: Kesh (uncut hair), Kangha (a wooden comb), Kara (a iron bracelet), Kachera (cotton underpants) and Kirpan (an iron dagger)

Article 25

Article 25 of the Indian Constitution deems the carrying of a kirpan by Sikhs to be included in the profession of the Sikh religion and not illegal.

Bharatmala Pariyojana

- The government's flagship programme for national highways, Bharatmala Pariyojana (BMP) Phase-I, initially proposed to be completed by 2022 will now be completed by 2027 Background:
- The government's ambitious infrastructure programme was approved by the Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs on October 24, 2017.
- Under BMP Phase-1, 34,800 km of national highways are supposed to be built or upgraded.
- The targeted deadline back then was five years, at an estimated outlay of Rs. 5,35,000 crore.

Foreigners Rights in india

- The Union government has urged the Supreme Court to help lay down a law with a "long-lasting" implication for the country on the subject of **Foreigners' Right to approach local courts** for relief after violating their visa conditions.
- The government's request came during the hearing of petitions filed by foreign nationals who were charged with violating COVID-19 guidelines by participating in a religious congregation in New Delhi during peak COVID outbreak.

Fundamental rights available only to Citizens

- 1) Prohibition of discrimination on grounds of race, religion, caste, gender or place of birth (Article 15).
- 2) Equality of opportunity in matters of public employment (Article 16).
- 3) Protection of freedom of Speech and expression, Association, Assembly, Movement, Residence, Profession (Article 19)
- 4) Protection of the culture, language and script of minorities (Article 29).
- 5) Right of minorities to establish and administer educational institutions (Article 30).

Clean Ganga

- The water quality of two stretches of the Ganga passing through Bihar and Uttarakhand, which were polluted earlier, has now improved and is of bathing standard with the biological oxygen demand (BOD), according to official data.
- The Ganga river water quality comparison between 2015 and 2021, the BOD level of the river flowing through Uttarakhand (Haridwar to Sultanpur) and Bihar (Buxar to Bhagalpur) is below 3 mg per litre, which falls in the unpolluted category.
- Not much change was seen in the BOD level of the river flowing through West Bengal between 2015 and 2021.



National Ganga River Basin Projects (NGRBP)

- 1) The current focus of world bank funded National Ganga River Basin Projects (NGRBP) of NMCG is on five major states on the main stem of river Ganga namely Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh, Jharkhand, Bihar and West Bengal
- 2) Under the Namami Gange Programme, the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) is carrying out water quality assessment of the River Ganga at 97 locations in five states through respective State Pollution Control Boards (SPCBs)

Biological Oxygen Demand

- 1) The BOD is an important parameter for assessing water quality.
- 2) It deals with the amount of oxygen consumption by biological organisms.
- 3) The lower the value, the better the water quality.

Delimitation commission – JAMMU & KASHMIR

- The Jammu and Kashmir Delimitation Commission released its draft report recently.
- The delimitation commission was constituted in March 2020.
- The commission is headed by retired Supreme Court judge Justice Ranjana Prakash Desai.

Delimitation

Delimitation is the act of redrawing boundaries of an Assembly or Lok Sabha seat to represent changes in population over time.

Kanya Shiksha Pravesh Utsav

- Launched by Ministry of women and child development in partnership with ministry of Education and UNICEF.
- The campaign aims to enhance enrollment and retention of girl students In the 11-14 years age group in schools.
- To be rolled out under Beti Bachao Beti Padhao initiative.
- Over 4 lakh out-of-school adolescents girls to be identified as primary beneficiaries.

First passenger train engine arrives in Manipur

- An engine arrived at the newly-constructed **Khongshang railway station** in Manipur's Noney district as part of a trial run for the first passenger train.
- The 111-km **Imphal-Jiribam railway line** being constructed at an estimated cost of about Rs. 14,322 crore.
- The project will connect Imphal with the country's board gauge network.
- The world's highest bridge pier is also being constructed near Khumji in Noney as part of the project.
- The 141- meter-high bridge will surpass the 139-meter Mala-Rijeka viaduct in Montenegro.
- Women performed traditional dances of the **Rongmei tribe** to welcome the engine in Thingou and Khongshang.

Women in Police

- According to Bureau of Police Research and Development, women police personnel constitute 10.3% of the police force all across India.
- Bihar possesses the highest percentage of women police personnel that is 25.30%, followed by Himachal Pradesh that has 19.15% and then Chandigarh at 18.78%.
- The **highest numbers of women inspectors are in Tamil Nadu**, 1055, followed by 425 in Maharashtra and 286 in Odisha.

Right to life vs Religious practice

- Recently, the Supreme Court agreed to examine an appeal by the Hindu Dharma Parishad against an order of the Madras High Court, which said the right to practise religion was subservient to the right to life.
- The High Court had upheld to not to open religious places during the peak of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- It had observed that when the right to life was threatened, the right to practise religion could take a back seat.

Right to Freedom of Religion (Articles 25 – 28)

There is freedom of conscience, profession, practice and propagation of religion. The State has no official religion. Every person has the right to freely practice his or her faith, establish and maintain religious and charitable institutions

Protection of Life and Personal Liberty: Article 21 declares that no person shall be deprived of his life or personal liberty except according to procedure established by law. This right is available to both citizens and non-citizens.

PM-Poshan & Samagra Shiksha fund

- Recently, a Parliamentary committee specified that there is a trend of gross under-utilisation of funds to run PM-Poshan and Samagra Shiksha schemes, that forms the backbone of education in the country.
- Out of total allocation of Rs 40,576 crore under the Centrally Sponsored Schemes, only Rs 23,572 crore was spent.

PM-Poshan

- This scheme provides one cooked meal in Government and Government-aided schools for students upto class 8.
- The scheme replaced the Mid-day Meal Scheme.
- It was launched for an initial period of five years (2021-22 to 2025-26).

Samagra Shiksha fund

- o It is an integrated scheme for school education covering students from pre-school to class XII.
- It aims to deliver inclusive, equitable, and affordable school education.



- o It subsumes the three Schemes of:
- Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA)
- Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA)
- Teacher Education (TE).

MGNREGA

- A Parliamentary Standing Committee has asked the Union Ministry of Rural Development to withdraw the caste-based wage payment provisions under MGNREGS and restore the single Fund Transfer Order (FTO) without segregating beneficiaries on caste lines.
- National Rural Employment Guarantee Act, 2005
- It was officially launched on 2nd February 2006
- o The Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act was passed on 23rd August 2005.
- o Provision of at least 100 days of work that provides guaranteed wage in a financial year

India's First Regional Rapid Transit System (RRTS) Train

- It will run on the **Delhi-Ghaziabad-Meerut corridor**.
- Designed by the National Capital Regional Transport Corporation (NCRTC)
- It will also be the first in the country to have a business or 'premium' coach on a regional corridor
- RRTS is the first-of-its-kind system in which trains, with a design speed of 180 kmph.

UN launches biodiversity talks on deal to protect nature

- Recently, UN biodiversity negotiations began in **Geneva**.
- It is held to hammer out a global deal to better protect nature that is due for approval in end of 2022.
- Almost 200 countries are due to adopt a global framework this year to safeguard nature by mid-century from the destruction wrought by humanity, with a key milestone of 30 percent protected by 2030.
- The Geneva meeting will announce new dates for COP 15.

Convention on biodiversity

The Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD), a legally binding treaty to conserve biodiversity has been in force since 1993.

It has 3 main objectives:

- 1) The conservation of biological diversity.
- 2) The sustainable use of the components of biological diversity.
- 3) The fair and equitable sharing of the benefits arising out of the utilization of genetic resources.

SIPRI Report

- The Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI) has released its latest report on Trends in International Arms Transfer, 2021.
- India and Saudi Arabia emerged as the largest importers of arms between 2017-21.
- 85% of India's overall imports were from three countries. Russia (46%), France (27%), and the USA (12%).
- USA, with 39% share, retained its standing as the world's largest arms exporters during 2017-21.
- **India was 23rd largest exporter** during 2017-21, with a share of just 0.2% of the global exports Source: Sipri.org

India and Sri Lanka

- Recently India has extended a **\$1 billion credit facility to Sri Lanka**. To help President Gotabaya Rajapaksa's government cope the current economic crisis.
- The "short term concessional loan facility" will be provided by State Bank of India.
- The Indian side has provided a \$500-million line of credit for purchasing fuel.
- A currency swap of \$400 million under the SAARC facility was also provided.
- India's NTPC last week signed an agreement for setting up a solar plant in Sampur in the eastern province of Trincomalee.


India's first Hydrogen based fuel cell e-car

- Toyota Kirloskar Motor Pvt Ltd and International Center for Automotive Technology (ICAT) are conducting a Pilot Project to study and evaluate the world's most advanced Fuel Cell Electric Vehicle (FCEV) **Toyota Mirai** which runs on hydrogen, on Indian roads and climatic condition
- It is a first of its kind project in India which aims to create a Green Hydrogen based ecosystem in the country.

• Fuel cell electric technology

- o A fuel cell generates electricity by forcing a fuel to react with oxygen
- o Electricity is generated in a fuel cell through a chemical reaction between the hydrogen fuel and oxygen. This happens by supplying hydrogen to the anode, or negative electrode and ambient air to the cathode or positive electrode.
- It produces no emissions other than water by converting hydrogen into electricity.






Green hydrogen

- Green hydrogen is defined as hydrogen produced by splitting water into hydrogen and oxygen using renewable electricity.
- It may be used to decarbonize sectors which are hard to electrify, such as steel and cement production, and thus help to limit climate change.



• India plans to manufacture five million tonnes of green hydrogen per annum by 2030

Small Satellite Launch Vehicle (SSLV)

- Recently ISRO has successfully completed the ground test of the solid fuel-based booster stage (SS1) of its new Small Satellite Launch Vehicle (SSLV).
- The Small Satellite Launch Vehicle (SSLV) is a small-lift launch vehicle being developed by the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) .
- SSLV is a three-stage all solid vehicle and has a capability to launch up to 500 kg satellite mass into 500 km Low Earth Orbit (LEO) and 300 kg to Sun Synchronous Orbit (SSO).

Low Earth orbit

A low Earth orbit (LEO) is an orbit around Earth with an altitude above Earth's surface from 160 kms to 1,000 kilometers

Most satellites, the Space Shuttle, the International Space Station and the Hubble Space Telescope are also present in LEO.

Sun-synchronous orbit

A satellite in a Sun-synchronous orbit would usually be at an altitude of between 600 to 800 km. The satellite always visits the same spot at the same local time – for example, passing the city of Paris every day at noon exactly.
